 " the day begins with moderate
 winds with rain at 2 pm the
 waist boat parton Stambard and
 Lanceland boat parton to the fair
 whale ship 12 miles off at 7 pm
 took the whale to the ship and made
 all fast for the night at 5 begin
 cut at 9 finished the body of one whale
 the waist boat got badly stove
 no oil to sea

 through the day fine weather
 all hands employed cutting at 11 Am
 begin to bail Lat 32° 21' N

Monday Aug 13 1849
 through the day employed boiling
 weather fine Lat 32° 35' 171° 50' E

Tuesday Aug 14 1849
 all the day employed boiling
 Lat 32° 15' N

Wednesday Aug 15 1849
 through the day moderate breezes
 and fine weather Lat 31° 51' N

Thursday Aug 16 1849
 all the 24 hours moderate
 weather no whales Lat 31° 30'

Friday Aug 17 1849
 first part employed bracing
 and latter part employed stowing
 down oil no signs of whales
 Lat 30° 32' N

Saturday Aug 18 1849
 through the day employed stowing
 down oil Lat 30° 34' N

Sunday Aug 19 1849
 through the day moderate weather
 Lat 31° 15' Long 170° 52' E

Monday Aug 20 1849
 first part moderate breezes
 and fine but no whales latter
 part the same Lat 31° 23'

Tuesday Aug 21 1849
 first part employed clearing
 ship latter part employed
 in repairing main top seal
 Lat 30° 48' N Long 167° 52'

Wednesday Aug 22 1849
 through the day moderate
 weather Lat 30° 25' N

Thursday Aug 23 1849
 all the 24 hours moderate
 weather Lat 30° 40' 166° 20' E

Friday Aug 24 1849
 through the day moderate weather
 Lat 30° 50' Long 166° 35'

Saturday Aug 25 1849
 through the day moderate
 weather Lat 31° 12' N

Sunday Aug 26 1849
 all the day moderate weather
 Lat 31° 30' N 167° 01' E
