all the 24 hours strong breezes
from S.E. Ship heading to the E.S.E.
Lat 30°30 Long 168°54 E

Monday Sept 17 1849
Though the day strong breezes
and fine weather Lat 30°14 S

Tuesday Sept 18 1849
first part employed repairing
foremast sail latter moderate
weather ship under all sail heading
to the Northward Lat 31°05 S

Wednesday Sept 19 1849
Though the day strong
gales from S.E. at 6 AM
I saw all a sail to the S.E. and
the first seen in 70 days
Lat 31°33 S



Thursday Sept 20 1849
Though the day mod strong
breezes and cloudy weather
at 10 AM I hauled ship
man, tello 47½ months out 1500
lbs sperm Lat 32°03 S 168°25 E

Friday Sept 21 1849
Though the day strong breezes
and cloudy weather no large
whales Lat 32°44 S

Saturday Sept 22 1849
all the 24 hours light breezes
and fine weather all hands
employed fitting rigging lat 32°48

Sunday Sept 23 1849
Though the day moderate breezes
and fine weather but no whales
Lat 32°26 Long 168°57 E

Monday Sept 24 1849
Though the day moderate breezes
and fine weather all hands employed
painting ship and masting soon
rigging Lat 31°57 169°30

Tuesday Sept 25 1849
first part employed masting
soon rigging latter part saw
Sperm whales so ended the day

Wednesday Sept 26 1849
at 2 PM lowered at 4 came
on board at 5 lowered again
struck and killed 1 whale at 6 AM
begin to cut at 9 finished and begin
to bail Lat 31°40 169°10 E

Thursday Sept 27 1849
Though the day strong breezes
and cloudy weather Lat 31°40

Friday Sept 28 1849
first part employed masting
soon rigging latter part
the same weather fine
latter 31°14 169°30 East

Saturday Sept 29 1849
Though the fine weather
but no whales Lat 31°41 S
Long 170°00 E
