Employed repairing main top sail
Ship general scutt in sight no whales
Lat 2 50 S Long 172 11 E

Friday Feb 15 1850

Through the day moderate weather
all hands Employed repairing main
top sail Lat 2 00 S Long 170 00 E

Saturday Feb 16 1850

Through the day moderate weather
at 8 am made Ocean high Island
at 11 1/2 the natives came of the north
but better made except women but
a plenty of them enough to
Lat 90 55 S Long 169 53 E

Sunday Feb 17 1850

first part squally weather
Latter part the same no whales
here but a plenty in Arctic Ocean
Latter part squally weather Lat 40 16 S

Monday Feb 18 1850

first part strong breezes from E
Latter part the same at 6 am same
pleasant Island Lat 24 S

Tuesday Feb 19 1850

the day begins with strong breezes
at 4 pm the boats came off from
pleasant Island with a few ga dogs
Latter part at 10 came off
again with dogs and cacadoes
to end the day

Wednesday Feb 20 1850

first part strong winds ship laying
off and on trading about one pm there
was a woman taken aboard in to the fore
Ca by my crew there being no one to
own who took it. I flugged 4 on 5 men
with the end of rope at 4 put away
the westward Latter part fine weather
Lat 00 06 S Long 166 10 E

Thursday Feb 21 1850

Through the day moderate winds
and fine weather but no whales
Employed mending and rigging
Lat 48 S Long

Friday Feb 22 1850

Through the day moderate winds
and fine weather the water Employed
repairing sail and fore & g sail ship
general scutt in company Lat 20 00 S

Saturday Feb 23 1850

the day began with moderate breezes
and fine weather all hands Employed
repairing fore sail no signs of
whales Lat 3 00 S Long 163 15 E

Sunday Feb 24 1850

Through the day moderate breezes
and fine weather saw some birds
whales but no sperm
Lat 4 37 S Long 162 02 E
