Through the day light airs and fine
weather but no whales Lat 29 23

Monday July 1 1850
Through the day calm and fine
weather Lat 29 21 S Long 171 00

Tuesday July 2 1850
Through the day calm and signs
of whales here Lat 29 23 171 00

Wednesday July 3 1850
first part calm weather fine
latter part employed bracing
out the S side of the after hatch
way to put down oil Lat 29 20

Thursday July 4 1850
first part employed stowing down oil
what little we have got latter part
employed bracing out to find a leak in
the oil pump 1 large cash part out it
seems hard to stay round here so hard
to get out and then lose it by bad cashes
still it may be right let us start money
the out Lat be hand Lat 30 00 S

Friday July 5 1850
Through the day calm and no whales
hear that I can find this makes the 6 day
of calm all hands on duty for the
first time since leaving port the
day has been very warm temper at 83
no hear no whales no ship to be
seen no wind to carries us over
the ground but I have in hopes of
better things Lat 30 00 S

Saturday July 6 1850
first part calm and very hot no
signs of whales here but hope that
blest gift of god to these men and
latter part calm and no signs of whales
oil stamped leaheng I have much to be stowed
with but I have no earnestness in all my
troubles Lat 30 00 Long 170 00 169 26

Sunday July 7 1850
first part very light airs from west
no signs of whales so hear that I could
find whales this season latter part calm
Lat 30 04 Lat 170 00

Monday July 8 1850
Through the day moderate breezes and fine
weather no signs of whales to the water
looks good Lat 30 24

Tuesday July 9 1850
Through the day moderate breezes and fine
weather and every thing steering but sperm
whales Lat 30 41 S J B 170 00

Wednesday July 10 1850
first part moderate breezes and fine weather
at 3 pm saw sperm whales lowered all
the boat at 4 struck and killed a large
whale at 11 hoisted the whale to ship and
hoisted in said from the night latter
part fine employed cutting at 12 am
got the body in at 8 am got all in
Lat 30 45 S

Thursday July 11 1850
Through the day employed sailing and clearing
all the day calm Lat 30 46 S
