Thursday Jan 16 1851
first part light airs from South
Ship heading to the westward but
made slow way. Lat 31 20

Friday Jan 17 1851
all the day calm weather fine
Lat 32 00 175 00 E

Saturday Jan 18 1851
through the day in calm weather fine
at 7 spoke in sail to upom
Lat 32 16 S 175 50 E

Sunday Jan 19 1851
first part light airs from S.E.
weather fine but saw signs of
whales here latter part spoke
Ship C. Mitchell Santachet 25
manthet and 1300 Spenn all well.
latter part moderate Lat 33 07
176 07 E

Monday Jan 20 1851
all the day light airs and fine
weather Ship steering to the Eastward
Lat 32 51 176 10 E

Tuesday Jan 21 1851
through the day moderate winds
and fine weather Land laid to the
beeward Lat 32 28 S 177 46

Wednesday Jan 22
through the day moderate winds
and fine weather at 7 pm spoke
Bunker Hanson of Limer spoke
Lat 33 03 176 11

Thursday Jan 23 1851
first part moderate winds from S.E.
Ship steering S.W. by S 20 fangs of whales
latter part fine breezes and pleasant weather
saw Blackfish but no Spenn whales
Lat 34 03 South Long 174 55 East

Friday Jan 24 1851
first part light breezes and fine weather
Ship steering S by W by the wind employed
letting up Shanks all hands on duty from
the first time since leaving the Sandwich
Islands latter part spoke in for the
Land at Lat 34 58 S 174 15

Saturday Jan 25 1851
first part moderate winds and fine weather
at 7 pm Shaked' aback of Cape Horn
at and 11 pm took aboard and food
in for the anchorage S. End the day

Sunday Jan 26 1851
the day begins with fine weather at
at 6 pm came to anchor in the
Bay of Islands in 6 fathoms water
with the best Bower 30 fathoms of Chain
spanned 4 ships at anchor Swift Limerick
dashed few pike

Thursday Feb 6 1851
at 4 am got under way and
part to sea with a crew of 24 men
sent home by Canoe at 6 the
Barlot left at 10 spoke the
Heads at 11 spoke Ship C. Mitchell
me Bunker Santachet 850 S
Lat 35 03 S Long 174 20 E
