at 11 a boat from this gen ship came
along with Capt Baker no sign to Eni the

first part light winds and fine weather
at 4 pm lowered four black fish got 4
to miltan and 5 to gen ship latter part
very weather many porpoises in sight
Land seen at times no abt to day

Saturday Feb 9 1851

all the 24 hours light balling
winds further rain land in sight
Lat 34 32 S

4 cash on hand this day \$201.50 in gold
161.60 in silver in all \$363.10

Sunday Feb 10 1851

Through the day moderate winds
and fine weather but no whales
Lat 34 20 Long 174 40 E

Monday Feb 11 1851

Through the day moderate winds
and fine weather Ship steering
to the eastward Lat 33 38 S

Tuesday Feb 12 1851

Through the day moderate winds
and fine weather Lat 33 36 177 10 E

Thursday Feb 13 1851

Through the day strong breezes from S.E.
no signs of whales here and my self sick
Lat 33 13 S Long 177 32 East

Friday Feb 14 1851

Through the day moderate winds and
fine weather but no signs of sperm whales
here Lat 34 03 S Long 175 00 E

Saturday Feb 15 1851

all the 24 hours moderate winds and
fine weather but no whales and myself
sick for some time and more of that
bleep and happy home where all my
Lat 34 45 S Long 175 37 E

Sunday Feb 16 1851

Through the day strong winds from S.E. &
Ship steering to the eastward by the wind
at anchor double reefed Top sails and courses
Lat 33 45 S

Monday Feb 17 1851

Through the day strong winds from S
Ship steering S by E & S no signs of
here Lat 33 22 S Long 178 37 west

Tuesday Feb 18 1851

all the 24 hours strong breezes and fine
weather Ship steering S by E by the wind
Lat 33 42 S Long 176 47 W

Wednesday Feb 19 1851

Through the day moderate winds from
S.E. Ship heading to the eastward no signs
of whales Lat 34 20 175 00 west
