Ship steering E by S under short sail
latter part moderate weather wind
from west SW abt to day

Saturday march 22 1851
all the 24 hours strong gals from
SW Ship steering East SW abt to day

Sunday march 23 1851
through the day strong gals
with a heavy swell SW abt to day

Monday march 24 1851
first part moderate winds with unpleasant
weather wind from SW latter part strong
winds from WSW Ship steering E by S
3 men Lieke of duty SW abt to day

Tuesday march 25 1851
through the day fine breezes from
SW Ship steering E by S by compass
SW abt to day

wednesday march 26 1851
first part strong wind from SW Ship
steering East at 1 pm saw a sail steering
to the SW latter part fine weather
Lat 52° 03 E by Chron 52° 53 by barom 52° 59

Thursday march 27 1851
all the 24 hours strong winds from
SW Ship steering E by S by compass at
5 pm spruce ship Pocahontas 8 months
out 100 days in SW abt to day

Friday march 28 1851
all the 24 hours strong winds from SW
saw a sail to the seaward SW abt to day

Saturday march 29 1851
first part strong winds from SW
Ship steering ESE at 5 pm saw
a ship steering to the westward latter
part more moderate at 11 1/2 am saw
the Island of Vigoes Lat 56° 38 South
Lat by Chron 78° 13 west

Sunday march 30 1851
the day begins with fine weather and
a pleasant wind from SW Ship steering
SE by S at 3 pm made Cape Horn
at 6 pm passed it and the Atlantic
necessaries this day of fire after absence
of 41 months Lat 55° 11 Long 65° 03

Monday march 31 1851
the day begins with strong winds from SW
at 4 pm entered the Straits of Lemaire
at the same time passed a merchant
ship steering to the southward at 6 pm
a bark steering for the Straits Lat 54° 05
