

Tuesday April 5 1851  
first part of the 24 hours moderate  
winds and fine weather no signs of whales  
2 men sick of Scurvy latter part thick  
fog a moderate breeze from west ship  
steering NNE by compass the watch employed  
reparing the jib and fore top mast stay  
sail Lat by obs 47° 21' South

Wednesday April 9 1851  
first part moderate winds from west ship steering  
SE by E latter part strong breeze from SSE  
ship steering SSE saw a fine back whale  
one man sick of Scurvy all the 24 hours foggy  
weather employed repairing the fore top sail  
at 11 Am saw a sail to the Eastward  
with her port tacks on board at noon  
sailed close to Lat 45° 53' South

Thursday April 10 1851  
all the 24 hours strong wind from South  
at 6 Am double reefed the top sails at 8  
tacks in the fore and main top sails and  
have the ship to sea the night 6 Am next  
app. with the watch employed repairing  
main top sail Lat by obs 44° 16' Long 55° 26'

Friday April 11 1851  
all the 24 hours strong winds from South  
ship steering SE by E at 8 Am saw a sail  
to the S and Eastward Mr Barber sick of Scurvy  
saw main top sail and fore sail and jib  
Lat by obs 41° 55' Long 54° 16' west

Saturday April 12 1851  
all the 24 hours strong gales  
from SW ship steering SE by S  
Lat by obs 40° 17' S

Sunday April 13 1851  
through the day strong gales from  
SW ship steering SE by S at 10 Am saw  
a sail to the Eastward bearing to under  
short sail Lat 38° 06' S

Monday April 14 1851  
through the day strong gales from SW  
ship steering SE by compass at 10 Am broke  
the Clamnet of Genevieve 16 1/2 months  
ant weight 1700 whale 100 Spinn oil  
brought to sea to sell ship and oil  
Lat 36° 29' Long 47° 58' west

Tuesday April 15 1851  
strong part strong gales from  
SW ship steering SE by S latter part  
moderate winds and fine weather no  
signs of whales Lat 34° 11' S

Wednesday April 16 1851  
through the day moderate winds from  
SW ship steering SE ship C in sight  
Lat 32° 47' Long 43° 40' W

Thursday April 17 1851  
all the 24 hours moderate weather  
at 2 Spoke ship Congress 21 Bedford  
24 months ant 1100 Spinn 1150 whale  
Lat 30° 57' S Long 42° 05'

Friday April 18 1851  
all the 24 hours moderate winds and  
fine weather ship Congress in sight  
at 5 pm Spoke her  
Lat 28° 27' Long 38° 07' W
