the day begins with moderate weather
wind from SSE ship heading SSEW by the
wind Lat 28° 38' Long 38° 51' west

Sunday April 20 1851
through the day moderate breezes and
fine weather saw a sail to the Eastward
Lat 27° 44' South Long 39° 14' W

Monday April 21 1851
through the day strong breezes from
SSE ship heading S by S by the wind
the watch employed mending fore
top sail Lat 28° 01' Long by
Chronometer 38° 29' W by Loran 38° 01' W

Tuesday April 22 1851
all the 24 hours moderate winds from
SSE ship heading SSE saw a sail to the
Eastward Lat 28° 14' South

Wednesday April 23 1851
first part strong breezes from East ship
heading to Southward latter part fine weather
and calm saw the ship C with her 56
barrel gun see her get out another one
Lat 27° 06' Long 35° 26' by Loran 34° 59'

Thursday April 24 1851
through the day moderate winds from
SSE ship heading to the NW Lat 26° 56'
Long 35° 14' by Chronometer 35° 26' west

Friday April 25 1851
through the day moderate breezes
and fine weather all hands employed
fitting rigging Lat 26° 49' 1

Saturday April 26 1851
all the 24 hours light airs from the
SSE at 11½ AM spoke ship
Clanmhorpe came hauled 17 months
out 2000 whale Lat 26° 28'

Sunday April 27 1851
first part moderate breezes fine
weather latter part squally at 11 AM
spoke bank came hauled
up Landon for Burnley Lat 26° 00'

Monday April 28 1851
through the day squally weather a sail
in sight Lat 25° 19' Long 33° 28' W

Tuesday April 29 1851
through the day moderate breezes and
fine weather all hands employed
fitting rigging saw a sail Lat 25° 00'

Wednesday April 30 1851
through the day light airs and
fine weather but saw sperm whale
Lat 24° 47' South 34° 01' west

Thursday May 1 1851
through the day moderate breezes and
fine weather saw a sail to the
westward Lat 23° 32' South
