

Ship Milton from N 2

Friday May 2 1851
first part squally weather wind from
SW ship heaving to the SE latter
part wind from SW to west ship
steering SSE by S. but 22° 33' South

Saturday May 3 1851
first part of these 24 hours moderate
winds and hazy latter part strong breezes
from SE ship steering SSE by E
all hands well on duty my self very
well Lat 21° 02' S Long 30° 20' west

Sunday May 4 1851
through the day strong breezes from
SE ship steering SSE by E sail a fair
to the westward Lat 18° 21' South

Monday May 5 1851
the day began with fresh breezes from
the South East with rain sail a fair
steering to SW but no signs of whales
Lat 16° 02' S Long 31° 30' west

Tuesday May 6 1851
first part moderate winds from
E & SE ship steering South middle part
squally weather sail a fair to the seaward
latter part fine weather all hands
employed fitting of rigging Lat 14° 09'

Wednesday May 7 1851
through the day moderate winds
and fine weather at 10 am spoke
the ship manichy of London 49 days
and Capt Rich Lat 11° 45' South

Thursday May 8 1851
all the 24 hours strong breezes from
SE ship steering SSE by Compass and by
the wind Lat 9° 50' South Long 31° 41' W

Friday May 9 1851
through the day moderate winds and
fine weather sail a fair to the seaward
Lat 7° 45'

Saturday May 10 1851
all the 24 hours moderate breezes
and fine weather ship steering SSE by E
Lat 5° 51' S Long 31° 45'

Sunday May 11 1851
first part moderate wind fine
weather sail a fair steering to SW
latter part much the same Lat 3° 40'

Monday May 12 1851
through the day moderate winds and
fine weather sail a fair to the seaward
Lat 1° 30' South Long 30° 31' W

Tuesday May 13 1851
first part moderate winds and fine weather
wind from SE ship steering SSE by
Compass latter part the same at 12 o'clock
made St Pauls Island bearing N by W
Lat 46 miles North Long 29° 15' west

Wednesday May 14 1851
through the day moderate breezes at 3 pm
passed St Pauls Island to the Eastward
ship steering SSE by Compass
Lat 24° 42' N
