Friday May 30 1851
Through the day moderate winds fine
weather Ship Steaming S by 8 200 Signs
of whales here Lat 22° 08' N Long 39° 50' W

Saturday May 31 1851
Through the day light breeze fine
weather Ship Steaming to the South
and Sail to the Eastward to the watch
Employed Steaming Ship Lat 23° 03' N

Sunday June 1 1851
first part calm and fine weather
Ship Steaming to South Set foremast
and Stacks latter part fine weather
Saw a sail Lat 23° 39' N Long 38° 40' W

Monday May 2nd 1851
Through the day calm all hands
Employed painting Ship Saw a sail
Lat 23° 07' N

Tuesday May 3 1851
first part moderately breezy fine weather
all hands Employed painting Ship
Saw several sails all Steering to the
westward Lat 24° 40' N

Wednesday May 4 1851
The day being with fine
weather all hands Employed
in painting Ship Saw 4 sails Steering
to the westward Lat 25° 39' N

Thursday June 5 1851
Through the day moderate winds fine weather
Saw a sail Steering to the westward S by
obs to day

Friday June 6 1851
first part moderate winds and fine
weather Ship Steaming S by 8 at 6 1/2 pm
Saw sperm whales lowered 2 boats
without success 7 1/2 fathoms in the
y of sails and hauled up 8 1/2 fms
in hopes of seeing the whales in
morning latter part fine weather
and light was from South at 9 Am
Saw sperm whales lowered Struck
and killed one small one the ends
with the boats in chase of the whales
Lat 27° 50' N Long 40° 52' W

Saturday June 7 1851
first part moderate breezes and fine
at 1 1/2 pm the boats returned
on board after getting up with
the whales and having one moped
So is my fate I have had aban^{on}
to have had 100 since evening
dine and have Lat 50 fms
latter part strong breezes and fine
weather at 6 Am Saw sperm whales
15 miles off Breaching at 9 Am lowered
3 boats Struck and killed 3 small
ones at 10 pm Cape the whales to
Ship and got ready for
Cutting Lat 28° 05' N
