

Friday June 20 1851
first part moderate breezes and fine weather
at 4 pm barometer up board from ship 2
bottles of beef and 14 casks of sperm oil
brought to wood & dry at 11 30 latter part
employed caulking up ribs to stone keelson
Ship B in light latter part strong winds
employed stowing oil at 6 finished Lat 31° 51'

Saturday June 21 1851
through the day moderate winds from N.E. 90
brought a new piece of 3/4 inch iron
No signs of sperm whales here
Lat 32° 35' N

Sunday June 22 1851
through the day moderate winds and fine
weather Lat 32° 20' N Long 48° 50'

Monday June 23 1851
through the day moderate winds and evening
weather wind from N.W. saw the ship B and
a bark in bay Lat 32° 10' 49° 30'

Tuesday June 24 1851
all the 24 hours moderate winds from
the westward No signs of whales
here Lat 32° 10'

Wednesday June 25 1851
through the day moderate breezes
and fine weather saw a sail to the
Eastward at 80 gave a steamer
Lat 32° 01' N Long 51° 30'

Thursday June 26 1851
X through the day moderate winds and
fine weather saw the ship Garland of
New Bedford being master & 2 days out
No ribs Lat 32° 10' Long 51° 10' W

Friday June 27 1851
first part light airs from N.E. & N.W. ship
steering west by the wind saw 2 sail
latter part calm employed painting
No whales to be found Lat 31° 59' N

Saturday June 28 1851
through the day calm & sail in light the
watch employed painting ship No whales here
Lat 31° 59' North

Sunday June 29 1851
first part calm and fine weather & sail in
light. No signs of sperm whales latter part
light airs from west Lat 32° 21' N 50° 40'

Monday 30 1851
first part moderate breezes fine weather wind
from west by N ship heading to the Northward
saw 2 sail 1 steering to N.E. and 1 to the
Southward

Tuesday July 1 1851
through the day strong breezes from
the N.W. ship heading to the N.E. & E. by the
wind out 7 AM saw a sail to the N.E.
Lat 34° 35'

Wednesday July 2 1851
first part of the 24 hours comes in with
light breezes from the N.E. & N.W. ship heading
to westward by the wind at 4 pm put on
L. J. Gifford's gun by board I am afraid of
my wife with him at liberty and the flame
against my feelings to do so yet I cannot
feel safe without in his power Lat 33° 51' N
strong breezes from the N.E. & N.W. weather fine
saw 2 sail steering S.W. Lat 33° 51' N
Long 57° 10' West.
