 first part moderate wind and fine weather
 ship steering better part part fine breezes
 from NNE ship steering West by N
 Lat 33 32

Friday July 4 1851
 first part pleasant weather and fine
 breezes Employed played in ship's boat
 at 5 1/2 pm saw a large sperm whale
 lowered but being so dark & night see him
 but once at 8 got an barrel and tail
 in hopes of seeing the whale again in
 the morning latter part light airs and
 fine weather at 6 am saw sperm whales
 going quick to the windward at 6 1/2 lowered
 the boats with out success at noon got
 an barrel and pulled away on our course
 Lat 34 20 Long 67 01 W

Saturday July 5 1851
 first part moderate breezes and fine weather
 saw 3 tail latter part strong wind
 fine weather Lat 34 55 N Long 68 39 W

Sunday July 6 1851
 first part strong breezes from
 SW ship steering SW by W saw 2 tail
 latter part squally weather with rain
 Lat 35 45 N Long 69 45 W

Monday July 7 1851
 through the day moderate breezes and
 fine weather saw a tail Lat 35 20

Tuesday July 8 1851
 all the 24 hours strong breezes
 from SW by W ship steering SW by W
 Lat 36 40 Long 61 50 west

Wednesday July 9 1851
 first part strong breezes from SW by W
 ship steering SW by W latter part fresh breezes
 with rain saw a tail steering to the SE
 Lat by obs 37 35 N Long 65 20 west

Thursday July 10 1851
 first part light airs and cloudy weather
 wind from west ship heading SSW by the
 wind a tail in light steering to the SSW
 latter part strong breezes and fine weather
 ship heading to the west NW under all sail
 Lat 39 11 N Long 67 05 west

Friday July 11 1851
 first part strong breezes from SW with
 rain ship heading WSW at 5 pm took
 in the 3 of sails wind increases in squalls
 latter part moderate winds from SW ship
 heading to the SW by W Lat 39 57 N Long 68 46

Saturday July 12 1851
 the 24 comes in with light breezes from
 WSW with foggy weather at 4 pm lowered
 but got no bait saw hulk and shot
 lowered for them at 6 1/2 pm bent the
 Lanchester chain a heavy swell running the
 Lanchester at 7 ship heads up SW by W
 latter part calm & sail in light at 10
 am spoke the Black Williams of
 New York neponset Spantucket South
 shall to come SW by W 40 miles distant
 Lat 40 30 N Long 69 21 Lat
 was to be perished on among the fog
