 heading E by S at 2 P.M. saw a large whale
 at 3rd Forward the harpoon and British Boats
 and struck him and he took the line
 at sunset came on board whale out of sight
 to windward ~~Three~~ more past fresh breezes
 took in light-sails Latter part light breezes
 from S.E. steering E by S sends them 24
 hours. Lat-33° 36' N Long 44° 23' W

Remarks onboard Thursday Sept-21st
 Commenced with light breezes from S.E.
 steering E by S broke out latter saw a Finback
 whale at night took in light sails middle
 part light breezes from S steering E by S
 Latter light airs from S.E. heading E by S.
 sends them 24 hours. Lat 36° 22' N
 Long 42° 35' W

Remarks onboard Friday Sept-22nd
 Commenced with light airs from S.E.
 heading S.E. ^{took in} ^{light sails} in Coiling Line and
 in the rigging middle part light airs from
 S.E. heading S.W. Latter part fresh breezes
 steering East ^{saw} ^{Finbacks} sends them 24 hours.
 Lat 37° 00' Long 40° 30' W

Remarks onboard Saturday Sept-23rd
 Commenced with fresh breezes from S.E.
 heading E. saw Finbacks at night took in
 light sails Middle part light winds from
 S heading E.S.E. Latter part the same
 the Baker sick off duty with the Fin & again
 sends them 24 hours
 Lat 36° 05' N Long 39° 15' W

Remarks onboard Sunday Sept-24th
 Commenced with light breezes from S steering
 E.S.E. saw nothing of note Middle part
 light breezes from S heading E.S.E. Latter
 fresh breezes from the same saw three
 sails. sends them 24 hours the Baker
 off duty sick Lat 38° 17' N Long 36° 39' W

Remarks onboard Monday Sept-25th
 Commenced with fresh breezes from
 S.W. heading S.E. by E. saw four sails
 and Finbacks at night took in main & 3rd
 middle part squally reefed Top sails
 Latter part fresh breezes saw four sails
 sends them 24 hours Lat
 Long

Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept-26th
 Commenced with fresh breezes from
 S.W. steering S.E. at 2.20 P.M. saw
 sperm whales toward at 4 struck one
 and lost him came on night middle
 squally with heavy rains Latter
 part calm with heavy squalls hanging
 round saw Whales and going quick
 lost sight of them in a squall
 sends them 24 hours. Lat 37° 32' N
 Long 34° 35' W

Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept-27th
 Commenced with heavy squalls from S.E.
 at 2 P.M. wore ship steering S by E blowing
 a gale reefed Top sails and took in main sail
 and 3rd middle part strong breezes Latter
 part more moderate with rain saw a sail
 sends them 24 hours. Lat 36° 30' N
 Long 34° 34' W
