Saw the first of 4 sails bound E,  
Lat 45:27 Long 31:8 W

(Brig Marys)  
Sunday Aug 26<sup>th</sup>  
First part of this day moderate N. winds banished dark  
Brig Marys bound to Recife, sent letter by her,  
latter part Wind N.W. saw several vessels bound E.  
Lat 44:37 Long 31:40 W

Monday Aug 27<sup>th</sup>  
This day a gale from N.W. laying to on S 1.50,  
Squalls of rain, Lat 44:00 N. Long 30:45 W

Tuesday Aug 28<sup>th</sup>  
This day strong N.W. winds & generally weather  
shy by the wind on S. task saw several merchant  
vessels bound E,  
Lat 44:5 N. Long 30:31 W


Wednesday Aug 29<sup>th</sup>  
First part of this day fresh W. winds & thick  
weather, latter part wind hauled N. & clear,  
steering Westward, Lat 43:29 Long 30:50 W

Thursday Aug 30<sup>th</sup>  
This day fresh N.E. winds steering N.W. S.  
A heavy swell, saw a brig bound Westward,  
Lat 42:36 N. Long 32:30 W

Friday Aug 31<sup>st</sup>  
This day light variable wind & calm, anchor in, topsail  
to repair, saw a B.K. bound E,  
Lat 41:58 N. Long 32:50 W

Saturday Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1860  
This day moderate North winds & pleasant weather  
at 5 P.M. saw the top of Flores bearing S. dist 60  
miles, saw & looked for Blackfish, but without success  
Spoke ship Sap wing, 3 months out, 150 bbl.  
Lat 41:00 Long 31:30 W

Sunday Sept 2<sup>nd</sup>  
This day light air from N. standing in for Corvo  
saw & landed. Manned Sallie Mears, of York town  
21 days from Baltimore bound to Maliga,  
at Anno Corvo bore S.W. dist 20 miles

 Flores  
Monday Sept 3<sup>rd</sup>  
This day light breeze from Westward, at 11 A.M. ship  
of Point Delgada Lanes. A shoe boat came of, bargained  
for 125 bbl of Potatoes union & co. pay in trade Potatoes 6000  
union & 2000 thardard, saying of and on ship Sap wing  
of N. Bedford, to End

Tuesday Sept 4<sup>th</sup>  
This day light breeze from N.W. saying of &  
on Flores took on board 100 bush Potatoes 6000 union  
pumpkin & 7, paid oil, flour, & Malacca, to End

Wednesday Sept 5<sup>th</sup>  
First part moderate E. wind at 12 M. ship of  
Santa Cruz, boat came of from shore, sold 5 Kegs tobacco  
& cloth, latter part strong breeze steering N.W. E,  
to End

Thursday Sept 6<sup>th</sup>  
This day a heavy E. wind with a heavy sea ship  
by the wind on S. task, a gloomy day,  
Lat 40:05 N. Long 31:20 W
