at 14 P.M. took in the topsail, between ten
and eleven, wind went round the corner, blowing
stronger, more ship twice, lost her boat, all her gear
& both sails, the best boat in the ship,
& none to replace her.

X Saturday June 28th
Can with wind from N.W. to N.E. & strong
& more moderate at 3 P.M. to A heavy gale
from S.W. haying too on a task under a sea of
fine spencer on spencer & calm of spencer.
Lat 45:30 Long 165:9

X Sunday June 29th
All this day A gale from S.W. N.W. &
& N.W. from land at 11 P.M. heavy squalls
thunder & lightning & hail, drove to the S.
