

Wednesday June 21st
Off Cape Behring, dist 5 miles, saw half a dozen
hals & whals, four ship looking.

Thursday June 22nd
Off Cape Behring, working E.

Friday June 23rd
Light variable air & calm, & foggy.

Saturday June 24th
Off Cape Whidbey several ships in sight.

Sunday June 25th
Off Plover Bay, at 8 A.M. saw spots in shore, in
the air, sent the boat in, N. boat took a whale & set her
line by the ice, saw several whales, spoke French ship
Custore of Harrow, reports Private ship Shenadoah, off
Cape Whaddens, having lost several ships, kept away
to the S.E. to get out of her track if she came in the
strait. Spoke & gained with ship Gov. Pease, So Ends.

Monday June 26th
This day light N. air. St. Lawrence Island bearing
E dist 10 miles, saw heavy smoke to windward supposed
to be burning ships, at 4 P.M. spoke ship Gov. Pease,
she had seen three ships on fire, kept away to the South.

Tuesday June 27th
Light N. air Steaming to the S.W. by a shore of ice.

Wednesday June 28th
At 12 M. closed the ice, Steaming S.E. light wind, fair
C.P.

Thursday June 29th
S.E. wind & foggy weather working to the S.E.

At 36 Winchester St

Friday June 30th
South wind, in came with
Ship Gov. Pease.

Saturday June 31st
Light variable air & foggy weather.

Sun. July 1st
N.E. wind ship heading by the wind on L Tack,
Lat 57: 24 N. Long 178: 36 W.

Monday July 3rd
Strong N.E. winds, thick foggy weather, lost sight
of our friend Gov. Pease, dull dreary and homesome.

Tuesday July 4th
Celebrated this day by cutting the fog with a knife,
cannot see a ships length, wind N.E.



Saturday July 15th 1865
At 7 A.M. ship near the Strait of
Cunimuk Island. Two boats went in there,
Gunning, at 11 returned, ran to the E along the shore
at half past twelve ship touched the bottom
more very lightly, hauled off shore, and M.S.W. & party
at 5 P.M. felt an Earthquake.
