November 26

Raised Whales at 5 A.M.
took 2 by L. & S. boat saw fine or two
whales. Bark G & Susan & Arnolda Whaling,
Lat 39:10 Long 56:13 W



Nov 28th

N. winds & some rain. Breaking out shocks
boiling, and slowing down. at 5 P.M. saw
3 R. whales going to windward. did not lower.
39:07, Edge of Soundings



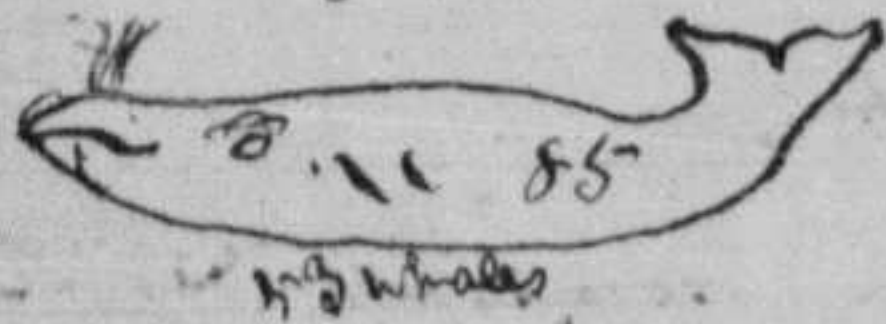
Dec 5th

Saw 3 whales at 1 P.M. & lowered.
Whales going S. fast. Come in thick, lost the
run of the whales. at 5 raised them & lowered
again. Struck and killed all three whales,
and all turned up near each other. took
them along side at dark. Lat 38:25 on Soundings.



Dec 12th

Saw a Small Right whale
near the ship at sunset, lowered but did
not get fast. Lat 38:50 55 fathoms water



Dec 13

N.W. winds. Saw a Whale at
7 A.M. lost the run of him. at 2 P.M.
saw two more going N. took 1 by L. boat.
got him along side at dark.
Lat 39:55 55 fathoms water.

1879

Jan 13th

Arrived at Cape Fairweather, Patagonia, last of Dec
Cruised about there and back. Saw no whales. Kept away N.
again. Saw G. & S. boats chasing 2 R. whales. Lat 41:43 Long 58:24

1879

Jan 20th

Moderate E. winds. at 5
P.M. saw a small R. Whale. took him by W. boat
Cut in. Lat 41:03. Long 59:45 (48 fathoms)



Jan 23

Strong N. winds with some fog. at 9 saw
3 whales. lowered, did not get fast. whales at home.
B.K. G. & Susan Whaling. Lat 42:45 (80 fathoms)



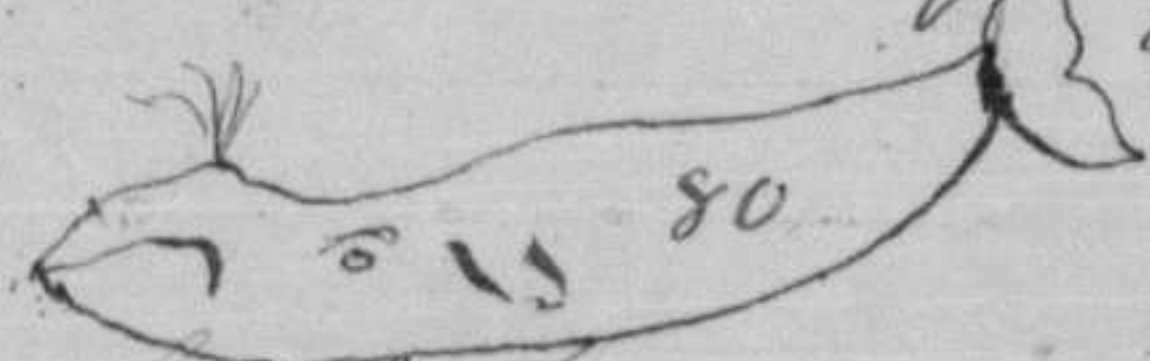

at 1 P.M. saw 1 R. whale. Cant him by L.
boat. Cap. Fairweather bearing W. by S. 1/2 S. dist
20, or 25 miles. Fleeting Whale fed



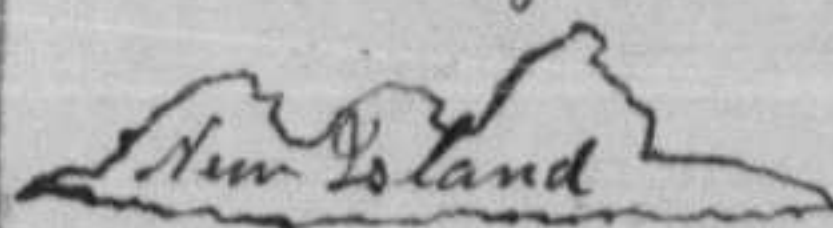
March 2nd

Saw 1 whale at 9 am took 1
by S. boat. B.K. Arnolda took a whale. Saw
three whales. Cape Virgin & Cape Fairweather. Both
just in sight from Mart Head. Lat 51:52 S.



March 8th

Left for New Island for
fresh water. Spoke the day before the Whaling Sch. Atonia
of N. Bedford with one whale. This still about here. Arnolda left
to day. Light breeze from N.E.



March 10th 1879.

Strong N. winds. at 1 P.M.
arrived at New Island. Sailed on the 14th
the Island produces plenty of sheep, beef, &
fresh water. (and wind) A.M. Ryan, was
Manager. Dickerson Shepherd.
