

Remarks on Board Ship Minerva
 Tuesday Feb. 25th 1845.

This day commenced with fine weather and strong S.E. trade winds with frequent squalls of rain at 7 A.M. hove the log and found her to be going 10 3/4 knots. Steering N.N.W. watch employed in knotting yarn making spun yarn and getting boats ready for painting them. Latter part watch employed in painting boats and setting up the main stay knotting yards &c so ends these 24 hours. Lat.

Wednesday Feb. 26th 1845.

This day commenced with fine weather and strong S.E. trades steering N.N.W. watch employed in making spun yarn, painting larboard and main boat. so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 11.40 South

Thursday Feb. 27th 1845.

This day commenced with strong trades steering N.N.W. watch employed knotting yarn making spun yarn and clearing starboard and bow boat. Latter part employed in painting them. broke out for meat vinegar molasses and Tallow. so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 11.52 S.

Friday Feb. 28th 1845.

This day commenced with strong S.E. Trades steering N.N.W. watch employed in making spun yarn and knotting yards. so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 16 South

Saturday Feb. 29th 1845.

This day commenced with strong S.E. trades steering N.N.W. watch employed painting boats knotting yards and making spun yarn. so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 13.26 S.

Remarks on Board Ship Minerva
 Sunday March 2^d 1845.

This day commenced with strong S.E. trades steering N.N.W. broke out for water in larboard part. wind hauling from S.E. to E. and back with squalls of rain latter part the same. so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 14.07 S.

Monday March 3^d 1845.

This day commenced with moderate S.E. trades steering N.N.W. watch employed in making spun yarn mats. ratling stuff and knotting yards so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 9.18 S.

Tuesday March 4th 1845.

This day commenced with light trades steering N.N.W. watch employed in shoaling duty making ratling stuff and c so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 6.30 S.

Wednesday March 5th 1845.

This day commenced with strong trades steering N.W. at 7 P.M. lowered for 2nd Irish and took one. Latter part raining so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 3.56 South

Thursday March 6th 1845.

This day commenced with calm weather and very rainy nothing to do but haul in and dunnage sails and shift over all day watch employed in making rope & mats. Lat. 2.37 South

Friday March 7th 1845.

This day commenced with calm and fine weather at 10 sprung up light wind from the E steering N. watch employed in boiling out blackfish and making spun yarn so ends these 24 hours. Lat. 2.00 S.
