

North Atlantic Ocean

April 17th

Saturday very moderate still weather
Three vessels in sight working southerly
Lat in 20.19' N 89.00' W

April 18th

Sunday almost calm and very warm
the entire day Lat in 21.08' N 89.09' W

April 19th

Monday moderate breezes from the
south and west all this day. 23.00' N 60.32' W

April 20

Tuesday first part squally. Latter hours
wind northerly and light 23.38' N

April 21st

Wednesday first hours light air with
high sea from north-west. one bark on
our lee standing northward. Latter hours
calm. High sea Lat in 24.00' N 60.33' W

April 22^d

Thursday light baffling winds and high
sea from the north-west Lat in 26.00' N 60.30' W

April 23^d

Friday squally from the south. Boarded
brig Helen Clifford of Bangor from Wilmington
N Carolina for Port au Prince Lat in 26.04' N 60.00' W

April 24th

Saturday fresh in squalls from the south
and west with rain. Spotted schooner La Rache
of N York was seen to be reported Lat 29.00' N 60.30' W

April 25th

Sunday wind veers westerly with heavy
head sea Lat in 31.08' N 67.08' W

April 26th

Monday first part strong north west
gales and high sea. Latter hours
calm and ruffled Lat in 32.10' N 66.13' W

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April 27th

Tuesday first and middle hours calm
with high sea. saw one schooner bound
north 1 Brig do 1 Bark Eastern. Bound latter
hours pleasant West wind 33.07' N 66.46' W

April 28th

Wednesday first hours moderate. middle and
latter strong & east gales saw five barks this day
heading eastward entered the gulf latter part
of the day. Lat by estimation 35.45' N 69.46' W

April 29th

Thursday Boisterous. violent heavy rains. Thunder
lightning high wind high sea and coming from
south to north all this day Lat by Est 37.00' N 70.00' W

April 30th

Friday first hours ruffled sea. light air
from the south. 3 PM ran out of the gulf
into fine weather and smooth sea. Latter
hours moderate. several vessels in sight
working northward Lat in 38.09' N 70.55' W

April May 1st

Saturday comes in moderate from
the westward. middle hours fresh breeze. Latter
part calm Montauk Dist 75 miles Lat in 39.41' N 71.43' W

May 2^d

Sunday first part calm and overcast sky with chilly
atmosphere. at 8 PM sighted several vessels
9 PM saw the land westward of Montauk and
hauled up easterly wind strong S.E. and strong
violent. Day light moderates and sets in foggy
depth of fog water hills lightening we saw the reef
and worked in to Stonington arriving at the
wharf at 10 a.m. also water so was the three cargo
of schooner Thomas Hunt. to south seas and back
again cargo 1600 fur seal skins
