Middle and Latter part fresh breezes and variable

Fine breeze from North and smooth water
rather cold. Middle and Latter part Strong
breezes and hazy, No Observation

Commences with thick foggy weather at 9 P.M.
brought to with Fore top sail to the mast at 2 a.m.
made sail Stead South, at 6 a.m. course S.E.
Latter part fine Moderate weather

Lat by Obs. 51. 53 S.

Thursday 17th

Fine pleasant weather winds from N.W.
course S.E. at 11 P.M. Single reefed Top sails
handed the mainsail Latter part Strong
breezes and clear weather

Lat. by Obs. 53. 46 S.

Friday 18th

First part fine Pleasant weather at
3 P.M. Saw Staten Land bore south by
Compass. Distance 20 Miles, middle part
Strong breezes and cloudy, Latter Moderate
and Clear

Lat by Obs. 55. 4 S.

Saturday 19th

Commences with fine clear weather
Middle and Latter part Strong breezes
attended with hard squalls
