

Sunday 20th November 1836.

First part Strong gales from N by N

Middle part thick foggy weather winds from N.N.W. and a heavy swell

Latter thick hazy weather with showers of rain course N.N.W.

Monday 21st Lat by Obs. 57. 7 S.

Commences with Strong breezes attended with hard Squalls and some rain

Middle and Latter as above no Observation

Tuesday 22nd Lat by Act 57. 37 S.

First part commences with cloudy weather winds from N.N.W. a heavy swell from the S.W. Middle and Latter Strong Gales attended with Snow Squalls.

Lat by Obs 58. 36 S.

Wednesday 23rd

Strong breezes attended with hard Squalls winds variable. throughout these 24 hours

Lat. by Obs 58. 11 S.

Thursday 24th

This day commences with passing Showers of Snow and rain Strong Gales at Intervals headed S.W. Middle and Latter part as above at noon tacked ship headed N by W.

Lat by Obs 59. 0 S.

Friday 25th November 1836.

Saw a Barge off the weather bow on the same tack as us. Still continue squally at 6 P.M. headed N.N.W. Middle and Latter part Strong breezes and passing Squalls of Snow and hail. Steering West winds from S by W.

Saturday 26th Lat by Obs 57. 44 S.

First part Strong breezes attended with hard Squalls. Middle as above at 7 a.m. saw a ship off the weather beam wore ship headed S.W. by S. Latter part Strong Gales from N.W.

Lat by Obs. 56. 36 S.

Sunday 27th

Commences with Strong Gales from N.W. at 3 P.M. hove her too under a closea reefa main top sail Fore and main Spencers, at 8 P.M. made sail Stena S.W. at 11 a.m. saw a Brig off the lee beam closea haula to the wind headed to the Northward

Lat. by Obs. 57. 28 S.

Monday 28th

First part Strong breezes attended with hard Squalls at 6 P.M. headed the main sail Reefa the Fore sail and set it at 3 a.m. wore ship headed S.W. by W. Still continue squally Latter part Strong breezes and clear weather

Lat by Obs. 56. 56 S.
