

Remarks Friday 18th August 1837.

First and Middle part of this day Moderate and clear Weather, Latter part Cloudy. Commenced setting up Shooks for Water the Major part of them are Powder posted badly.

Latitude at noon 3. 17 S.

Longitude 81. 51 W.

Saturday 19th

This morning at 7 o'clock close in with Pt. St. Helena two sail in sight off the Larboard bow standing off shore, very hazy over the land, Middle part fine Weather and gentle breezes at sun set took in all light sail, hauled up the main sail, headed off shore, this day Employ'd setting up Shooks.

Sunday 20th

This morning at daylight we were midway between Pt. St. Helena, and Selango at 5 o'clock came to an anchor in Selango in 12 Fathoms Water half a mile off shore,

Monday 21st

At daylight sent a Raft of cask on Shore at 7 o'clock two boats crews went on Shore Wooding at noon all hands on Shore Except the Cook Stewart Randolph and myself. This day finish'd setting 100 barrells of Shooks marked J.L. N^o 37 not came to hand,

Remarks Tuesday 22nd August 1837.

This day all hands on Shore Except Cook Stewart and myself,

Wednesday 23rd

This morning at daylight sent a raft of cask on shore, people Wooding untill noon Afternoon filling of Water John Thomas and Davis Absconded,

Thursday 24th

This morning brought a Raft of Water to the ship the remainder part of the day people Employ'd Stowing Water Broach'd a barrell of Beef.

Friday 25th

This morning people Employ'd Stowing Wood and Water in Fore hold about 9 o'clock saw Davis on the beach sent a boat and brought him on board at 10 o'clock sent a Raft of cask on shore and fill'd them Afternoon a Shore after the Water, Davis and Turner Absconded,

Saturday 26th

This morning People Employ'd Stowing wood and Water Afternoon brought four boat loads of Wood to the ship and took in the old boat Shooks 6 of the J. Shooks 1 old 60 the Butter was in, Capt'n Exchange's 1 barrell of B. fish oil for two thousand Brandy
