

Remarks Sunday 27th August 1837.

This day on shore on Liberty with Mr. Patch
Mr. Meloy and Soughty at sun set brought
a man on board that left the ship Panama
Monday 28th

This morning weigh'd anchor made sail
headed off N. S. W.

Tuesday 29th

At 7 o'clock this morning tack'd ship headed
up E. S. E. thick hazy weather throughout this
day at 7 o'clock this Evening wore ship headed
to the Southward & Westward no observation

Wednesday 30th

This morning commences with light air and
foggy at 11 o'clock wore ship headed to the
Southward & Eastward a sail in sight off
the weather bow Latter part gentle breezes
and clear weather, Latitude at noon 1. 28 S.

Thursday 31st

This morning very thick foggy weather
and Moderate breeze middle part Increasing
breeze Latter strong breezes took in all light
sail at 7 o'clock wore ship headed N. S. W.
Latitude at noon 1. 56 S.

Remarks Friday 1st September 1837.

This morning hazy weather and a light
breeze A ship in sight off the lee beam headed
in shore at noon tack'd ship headed up E by S.
Middle and Latter part moderate breezes and
cloudy weather Latitude at noon 1. 59 S.

Saturday 2nd

This morning fine Pleasant weather two
sail in sight to leeward of us Middle
part falling showers of rain Latter part strong
breezes and cloudy weather Broach'd beef Pork
and Flour shook'd the 60 that contain'd the
Flour at sun set tack'd ship headed S. W. by W.
Latitude at noon 2. 19 S.

Sunday 3rd

Commences with clear weather and a
Moderate breeze at 7 o'clock tack'd ship headed
E. S. E. middle and Latter part as above spoke
the ship Hope of New Bedford,
Latitude 2. 19 S.

Monday 4th

Moderate weather and hazy raised
Whales myself lowered two boats Starboard
boat took a very small one three ships
in sight, at 1 o'clock tack'd ship stood
to the Southward & Westward afternoon spoke
The Charles of London, Latitude 2. 40 S.
