

Remarks Tuesday 5th September 1837.

This day commences with Fresh breezes cold and Cloudy Weather at day light tack'd Ship headed E by S a sail in sight off the bow Middle part moderate at 4 o'clock Met hold the first time, nearly sun down. W. Molloy raised a Whale off the lee bow lowered two boats the Starboard boat took him
Latitude 2. 59 S.

Wednesday 6th

This day cut in the Whale at sun down Wore Ship stood to the Southward & Westward
No Observation

Thursday 7th

This day trying out &c. at noon tack'd Ship headed E. S. E. spoke the Barque Marcella, at 4 o'clock Pump Ship no sign of oil,
Latitude 2. 59 S.

Friday 8th

All hands Employ'd as yesterday at sun set Wore Ship headed N. W. Latitude 3. 2 S.

Saturday 9th

At 7 o'clock this morning tack'd Ship headed S. E. by E. finish'd boiling and cleared off decks.
Latitude 3. 7 S.

Remarks Sunday 10th September 1837.

Fine Pleasant weather and light air at 9 o'clock saw Whales breaching four Points off the Weather bow supposed them to be sperm Whales at noon lowered two boats and pull'd about ten or twelve miles came up with them they proved to be Humpbacks at sun set tack'd Ship headed W by S
Latitude 3. 13 S.

Monday 11th

This morning at 7 o'clock tack'd Ship headed S. E. Fine moderate weather throughout this day all day on Deck Trimming Water cask for oil shot & on 26 Inch cask and remade it
Latitude 3. 19 S.

Tuesday 12th

This morning at day light close in with the Land Strong gales throughout this day
Latitude 3. 51 S.

Wednesday 13th

This morning thick hazy weather middle and latter part clear all hands Employ'd breaking out and stowing oil Starboard side Fore hold,
