

Remarks Thursday 14th September 1837.
Commences with damp foggy weather middle
and latter part fine clear weather and a
moderate breeze this day finished stowing
the fare of oil.

Friday 15th

This day Employ'd setting up shooks marked
for oil. Fine pleasant weather throughout
this day brocked a barrel of beef

Saturday 16th

Strong breezes throughout this day.
Employ'd as yesterday. Latitude 4. 39 S.

Sunday 17th

Strong breezes throughout this day.
Latitude 4. 35 S.

Monday 18th

Strong breezes attended with hard squalls
throughout this day. Hauled reef the fore
top sail and single reef the main and
mizen took in the Spanker & jib wore ship
headed S.W. by W. Latitude 4. 18 S.

Tuesday 19th

This morning moderate weather out reefs
all possible sail set at 3 o'clock this
afternoon tack'd ship headed E.S.E.

Latitude 4. 36 S.

Remarks Wednesday 20th September 1837.
Strong breezes throughout this day at sun
set took in all light sail.

Latitude at noon 4. 48 S.

Thursday 21st

Fine pleasant weather and strong breezes
throughout this day a ship in sight off
the bow at 10 o'clock Cape Blanco in
sight two points off the lee bow, this day
Employ'd putting a store in a gal and
Remain one sla 60 that contained clay
at sun set tack'd ship headed off shore

Latitude at noon 4. 44

Friday 22nd

Fine clear weather and a pleasant breeze
throughout this day at 1 o'clock tack'd ship
headed in shore at sun set took in the
light sails and hauled up the main sail

Latitude at noon 5. 14 S.

Saturday 23rd

At daylight off Payta Head at 1 o'clock
came to an anchor in twelve fathoms water
in Payta Harbour 1 mile off shore.

Sunday 24th

Laboard watch on Liberty
