This day stow'd oil the Starboard side
after cold Strong Gales and a heavy
Swell throughout this day,

Friday 20th

First and Middle part of this day the
Weather as yesterday Latter more Moderate
Finish'd Stowing Provisions &c. and packed
off at 4 o'clock this day Shook'd four 60
Mark'd them R.

Saturday 21st

Cloudy and Squally weather the most
part of this day,

Sunday 22nd

First part of this day cloudy and
cold Middle and Latter fine clear
Weather Spoke the ship Washington of
Nantucket,

Monday 23rd

This Morning a sail in sight off our lee
Quarter fine clear Weather throughout
this day trim'd a Bread cask for oil,

Tuesday 24th

Fine clear Weather and light airs throughout
this day trim'd two 40 Inch cask one Sap
and one Sap Hoarvon. that contain'd sails
which makes 54 Barrells on hand for oil,

Remarks Wednesday 25th October 1837.

Fine Pleasant weather and light airs the
most part of this day trim'd a J.L. Shook
cask Reduced him to 138 Gall^{ns} for oil,

Thursday 26th

First and Middle part of this day Squally
Latter fine and Pleasant weather trim'd a
cask that contain'd Flour for oil and
made a bid for the cook to take the
Peoples bread forward in,

Friday 27th

First part of this day Strong breezes and
cloudy Middle and Latter more Moderate
packed a Barrell of beef,

Saturday 28th

Strong breezes and cloudy weather throughout
this day trim'd a Cask that contain'd
Molasses Sugar for oil,

Sunday 29th

Fine Moderate weather throughout this
day,

Monday 30th

Fine clear and Moderate weather
throughout this day trim'd one beef
and one that contain'd tongues and
Gounds, for oil,
