

Remarks Monday 4<sup>th</sup> December 1837.  
This Morning Strong breezes and a heavy  
swell at 1 O'clock spoke the Barque  
Marcella middle and Latter part more  
Moderate,

Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup>  
This morning started a cask of Manilla  
Lines and a 60 of Flour, trim'd them  
for oil, commenced making runs out of  
oil cask Shooks, fine Weather throughout  
this day,

Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup>  
Employ'd making runs and trim'd a 209  
Gall. cask that contain'd fresh Water  
for oil, fine Moderate weather throughout  
this day,

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup>  
This Morning hard Squalls attended with  
Piping showers of rain saw the Barque  
Marcella off our lee beam, she tack'd head'd  
in shore middle part moderate at noon  
tack'd ship head'd in shore at 6 O'clock reef'd  
Fore and Mizzen topsails haul'd up main  
sail took in the jib Strong breezes and  
Squally, Employ'd as Yesterday,

Remarks Friday 8<sup>th</sup> December 1837.  
This day Mr. Patch built up the forward  
part of the tryworks, myself Employ'd as  
Yesterday and trim'd one sand barrell  
for blackfish oil, Cloudy Weather and  
Piping showers of rain throughout the day  
Latitude at noon 13.54

Saturday 9<sup>th</sup>  
This morning fine Weather at 8 O'clock  
saw Whales off the lee bow lower'd, the  
Starboard boat took one 40 barrell whale  
in the after noon lower'd again the Starboard  
boat took one more of the above size,  
Sunday 10<sup>th</sup>

This morning cutting in saw Whales off  
the Weather bow lower'd no Success at 2  
O'clock started the works, this afternoon  
set up two 60 Shooks mark'd R. nos 4 & 5.  
Started four 60 of Flour trim'd them for oil  
broach'd a barrell of beef.

Monday 11<sup>th</sup>  
People Employ'd boiling and breaking out  
in the Fore hold for Shook heads, trim'd one  
Water 60 and started six 60 of Flour and  
fitted them for oil, the 60 that contain'd  
the Butter and the junk cask,
