

Remarks Tuesday 28th Decr. 1841
This day commences with Strong breezes
from E. N. E. Course S. S. W. at 6 A. M.
Spoke a French Brig from Palparaiso
Middle part Drizzling rain at day light
broke out in the fore hold for Water
Latter part fine Weather Lat. 16. 52 S.

Wednesday 29th
Strong breezes throughout these 24
hours. Lat 19. 40 S.

Thursday 30th
This day Commences with Strong breezes
from N. N. E. Course S. S. W. 5 W.

Middle as above, at 8 A. M. took in to
Double reef Topsails, blowing heavy,
Attended with Rain No Obs.

Friday 31st
First part Variable winds and
Squally with a heavy Swell from
S. E. headed S. W. by S. Middle and
Latter Strong breezes and Cloudy weather
No Obs.

Saturday 1st January 1842
Strong breezes and a heavy swell and
Passing showers of Rain Middle and
Latter more Moderate all sail set.
Lat 24. 00 S.

Remarks Sunday 2nd Jan^y. 1842
This day commences with fair Weather
Breezed broad by and Fork Middle
and Latter light breezes.

Latitude 25. 18 S.

Monday 3rd

First and Middle part fine Weather
and fair breeze at 5 A. M. untent the
Fore sail and repaired it Latter part
fine Weather.

Latitude 27. 15 S

Longitude 39. 30 W.

Tuesday 4th

This day commences with a fine Steady
breeze from S. E. Course S. W. by S. Middle
and Latter winds from N. N. E. at 10 A. M.
Long. 7. Lunar 41. W.

Latitude at noon 29. 05 S.

Wednesday 5th

This day begins with fair Weather
Winds from N. N. E. saw a Brig
Standing to the Eastward, Middle
and Latter thick hazy Weather course
S. W. by S. No Obs. - -
