

Remarks Thursday 6th Jan^y. 1842
This day commences with hazy weather
and strong breezes from the Northward
Attended with Rain Middle part more
Moderate and heavy Showers of Rain
and Variable winds At 9 A. M. Longitude
of Lunar 43. 20 W. Latter Calm.

Latitude by Obs. 32 51 S.

Friday 7th.

First part light breezes from the
Westward headed South, Eastly Middle
and Latter light airs and Variable
Saw two sail off the Weather Quarter
at 10 A. M. Longitude of Lunar 43. 09

Latitude at noon 33. 05 S.

Saturday 8th.

This day commences with light breezes
and Clear weather three sail in sight
Middle and Latter part light airs and
Variable

Latitude 33. 12 S.

Sunday 9th.

Light airs from the Northward & Eastward
Course S. W. by S. Middle part an ^{airy} increasing
Latter strong breezes and Clear weather

Latitude at noon 34 29 S

Longitude of Chron. 44 34 W.

Remarks Monday 10th Jan^y. 1842

First part of this day strong breezes from
N. W. by N. Steering S. W. by S. at 5 P. M. saw
Whales of some kind four miles off to wind-
ward of us luff'd the ship to the wind at sun-
set double reef'd the Topsails took in the Jib -
Middle part more Moderate at 6 A. M. saw
Whales 3 Points off the lee bow at 7 lowered
the boats after a long chase the waste boat
fastened and hauled Latitude at noon 34. 56 S.

Tuesday 11th.

Fine Moderate weather saw Whales
lowered two boats the Larboard boat struck
a large one and got badly stove took him
alongside at 7 P. M. commenced cutting
at 4 A. M. Lat 34 46 S.

Wednesday 12th.

Saw a Whale a short distance from
the ship saw a Brig to leeward of us
taking a Whale Alongside finished cutting
at 9 P. M. commenced boiling at 5 A. M.
some little rain the Latter part no obs.

Thursday 13th.

Shook a cask in the Ground and set
it up for oil trying out then 24 lbs
brought by and Fork
