

Remarks Wednesday 2nd Feb. 1842

This day commenced with fine clear weather headed from S by E to S.E. Winds S.W. Variable Middle part fine clear weather and light breezes at 8 A.M. Longitude of Lunar 51.53 W. Latter light breezes and clear, headed S by W.

Latitude at noon 47.52 S.

Thursday 3rd

Fine clear weather and light breezes at 2 P.M. set the top Gallant sails at 7 P.M. took in top Gallant sails at 8 P.M. Double reefed the topsails took in the Gib and main sail at 9 P.M. Furla fore topsail Strong gales at S.W. southerly at 6 A.M. Tacka ship headed W by N. at 11 A.M. tacka headed S.E.

Latitude 48.40 S.

Friday 4th

Longitude of Chron. 52.09 W.

This day commenced with favourable weather made all sail headed S by E. at 4 P.M. took the main top Gallant sail at 5 P.M. Double reefed topsails headed the main sail and Gib Strong gales at S.W. Middle part the Gale increased closed reefed the fore and main topsails and furla the Mizzen thick hazy weather and strong gales headed S by W. Lat 49.40 S.

Remarks Saturday 5th Feb. 1842

Strong gales and a heavy sea winds at 4 M. southerly clear weather at 3 P.M. Furla fore topsails Middle and Latter Strong gales headed S by E. Latitude 50.44 S.

Sunday 6th

Strong gales and a heavy sea brackish and fork. at 6 P.M. the weather more moderate set the fore and Mizzen topsails closed reefed fore ship headed W by N. at 9 P.M. fore ship headed S by E. hard squalls at intervals.

Middle part Strong breezes and squalls at 8 A.M. out two Reef. Topsails Reefed the main sail and set it set the Gib weather more moderate. Latitude at noon 51.10 S.

Monday 7th

This day commenced with a calm at 2 P.M. a breeze sprung up from the N.E. attended with rain & sun S.W. at 7 P.M. in the second reef Topsails at 9 P.M. wind headed on off to W.M. at 1 A.M. took in to a close Reef main topsail hove on to wind S by E. Latter part more moderate Lat 51.18 S.
