Lying to the whole of these 24 hours Strong
gales at S.W. at 10 A.M. hauled the
Fore Sail Latitude 56. 44 S-
Thursday 24th

Strong gales and hard squalls at
intervals abated with some rain under the
same sail as yesterday Lat 57. 04 S-
Friday 25th

Weather more moderate at 2 P.M. a Strong
breeze from North Course N.W. at 9 P.M.
the wind hauled to S.E. Strong breeze and
Raining at 2 A.M. Hauled the Fore topsail
Latter part Strong gales saw a Ship to windward
of us Steering N.W. Lat 56. 48 S-

Saturday 26th
Weather rather more Moderate set the
Fore and Mizzen topsail at 1 P.M. out
one Reef Fore and ^{main} topsails at 5 A.M.
set the mainsail out Reep the main
topsail Strong breeze and Peeping
Showers of Hail Lat 55. 28 S-

Sunday 27th
This day Commences with a fine breeze
from S.E. Course N.W. Middle and Latter
part fine Moderate Weather Lat 52. 52 S-
Long 92. 13 W.

Fine Moderate weather at 2 P.M. set
Fore topmast Studding sail, Course N.W.
Middle part light breeze and Cloudy Latter
Winds from N.W. and Moderate
Latitude 51. 01 S-

Tuesday 1st March.
Fine pleasant Weather winds N.W.
Course N.W. at 4 P.M. Broach'd beef
and Pork Middle and Latter fine
Weather and a Steady breeze,
Latitude 48. 33 S-

Wednesday 2nd
Fine Moderate weather winds N.W. Course
N.W. Middle part Cloudy and Strong
breezes at intervals at 5 A.M. broke out
in the main hatch for Water at 10 A.M.
saw a Barque Standing to the S.E. Strong
breezes throughout Latitude 46. 12 S-

Thursday 3rd
Fine Steady breezes at N.W. at 4 P.M.
saw a large Whale to Windward of us going
very quick. at 11 P.M. the wind hauled to
S.E. Course N.W. Latter part Steady
breezes and fine Weather
Latitude 43. 46 S-
