Fine Steady weather winds at S.E. Course
N by W. Middle and Latter part Steady
Breezes and Cloudy Latitude 41. 17 S.
Saturday 5th

Fine Pleasant weather winds at E by S.
Course N by E. Middle part some Passing
Squalls at 6 A.M. then N by E. Latter
Fine clear Weather Latitude 38. 55 S.
Sunday 6th

Fine Moderate and clear Weather winds
from East southealy Course N by E. Middle
and Latter fine Moderate Weather

Monday 7th Latitude 37. 19 S.
Fine pleasant Weather winds from S.E. Course
N by E. at 6 P.M. spoke the Com^{dr} Morris
of Falmouth 97 Days out Clean at 7 P.M.
Shortened sail hefted to the wind headed E by S.
with Strong breezes. This Evening the Sea lay at
Midnight to Commence civil time or daily
occurrences on Cruising ground the Carpenter
Employed altering the after hatchway
Latitude 36. 56 S.

Remarks Tuesday 8th March 1842.
This day trimed one fresh Water cask for
oil 298 Gall^{rs} at 1 O'clock saw black fish
lower the boats the Waste boat took one
fine clear Weather Latitude 35. 39.

Wednesday 9th
All day on Deck trimed one Provision
barrel for black fish oil and various other
jobs. saw a Brig pass to windward of us
steering to the S.E. at noon saw the Solana
Juan Fernandez Latitude 34. 35 S.
Longitude 79. 30 W.

Thursday 10th
This Morning at day light broke out in
the main hold for Water trimed one bread
cask for fresh Water and made a Dish Tub for
the Stewards, Latitude 34. 06 S.

Friday 11th
At 10 O'clock this Morning spoke the
Barge Henry of Salem 5 Months out
Clean, saw a Whale four Points off the
Weather bow lowered and chased him till one
O'clock no Success Latitude 33. 56 S.

Saturday 12th
This day trimed one 283 Gall. Cask for oil
brocked by and Fork. spoke the Ship H^{on} Astor
Kantusket and Com^{dr} Morris off the Island of Fuera.
