

Remarks Wednesday, 6th April 1842.

This morning at 7 o'clock saw Humpbacks
McIlhenny's Hill bore E.N.E. from us. Moderate and
Cloudy Weather the most part of the day.

Thursday, 7th Latitude at noon 23. 15 S.

Moderate and Cloudy throughout this day
steering N.E. by N.

Friday 8th

This Morning broke out in the
main hatch for Water broach a Cask
of Bread light breezes and Cloudy
the most part of this day.

Saturday, 9th

Fine Clear Weather and light breezes.

Painted the Harbours boat, Lat. 19. 58 S.

Sunday 10th

This day we eat our meals in the Storage
light and Clear Weather Lat 19. 00 S.

Stosa boats crew. Matches this night.

Monday 11th

Fine gentle breezes and Cloudy steering N.W. by N.

People Employ'd painting ship and side

Spoke the Barque Make of N Bedford 20

Months out 800 bbls. saw a Merchant Ship

steaming to the Southward - Lat 18. 04 S.

Remarks Tuesday, 12th April 1842.

This Morning, saw a Barque steering to
the Northward and Westward at noon she
cross'd our bows she had a launch towing
astern, at sun set we were off Ilo. Distance
from the Land 40 Miles.

Wednesday, 13th

Fine breeze and Cloudy the most part of
this day People Employ'd setting up and pulling
down fore Rigging Taring &c.

Thursday, 14th

Fine Moderate weather Latitude at noon
16. 12 S at 8 o'clock spoke the Ship Mops of
N. Bedford 16 Months out 250 bbls.

Friday, 15th

Fine pleasant Weather throughout this
Latitude at noon 15. 36 S. Longitude day
at 2 o'clock φ Lunar 74 52 W.

Saturday, 16th

Fine Moderate weather throughout this
day People Employ'd Painting ship
inside Latitude 14. 59 S.

Sunday 17th

Fine clear Weather and strong breezes
the latter part of this day Latitude 14. 08
Longitude φ Lunar 77. 28 W.
