

Remarks Monday 18th April 1842-

This morning broke out in the Fore and
main hatches for water shook heads &
hoop &c. - Set up four shooks hoop'd with 5^d.
Nos. $\left. \begin{array}{l} 7. 284 \\ 8. 249 \\ 9. 240 \\ 10. 237 \end{array} \right\} 32 \text{ bbls. } 2 \text{ Gallons for fresh water}$

Tuesday 19th

This day set up 3 Shooks Nos. $\left. \begin{array}{l} 13. 243 \\ 14. 258 \\ 15. 229 \end{array} \right\} 23 \text{ bbls } 5$
Fine weather throughout this day saw a Barge
standing off shore at sunset the Island Lorenzo
bon N.W. by S. from us - 20 miles distance

Wednesday 20th

This morning foggy and calm at 10
o'clock a breeze sprung up, heading for
Lorenzo. Latitude at noon 12 30 at sunset
Callao in sight, headed her off shore, under
short sail,

Thursday 21st

This morning at daylight Lorenzo bon E by N
from us about 12 miles at 2 o'clock came
to an anchor in Callao harbour.

Friday 22nd

This morning sent a Raft of Cask on Shore
filled them and brought them off along side
at 2 o'clock trim'd bread Cask and
Casks that contain'd sails for fresh water

Remarks Saturday 23rd April 1842-

This day shook a few of the Ground tin cask
marked them W. 1 to 5. Started two Cask of
Flour and fill'd them with fresh water,

Sunday 24th

Starboard Watch ashore on Liberty

Monday 25th

This morning sent a raft of Cask on shore and
fill'd them in the afternoon sent a Small Raft
and fill'd them took on Board at sunset
