

Remarks Tuesday 3rd May 1842.

Heaved off Shore the whole of this day

Wednesday 4th

Heaved off as yesterday Latitude at noon 13.31 S-

Thursday 5th

Moderate and Cloudy weather throughout this day.

Friday 6th

Fine Moderate weather and gentle breezes saw two sail pass to windward of us standing to the southward Lat 13.19 S-

Saturday 7th

Moderate weather and cloudy at intervals broached by and Pork Latitude at noon 12.33 S-

Sunday 8th

This day laying off and on in Callao sent a boat on shore.

Monday 9th

This day laying off and on in the harbour sent a boat ashore brought the Cook on board in the Evening one of the deserters.

Tuesday 10th

This day made two deck buckets and one oil can fine Steady ^{weather} heaved to the N.W. Latitude at noon 12.02 S-

Remarks Wednesday 11th May 1842.

This Morning broke out in the after hold for Provisions to Cooper trimia all on the Starboard side Strong breezes heaved ~~not~~ saw a brig standing to the S.E.

Thursday 12th

Broke out the Starboard side and trimia ~~and~~ the remainder of the Provisions found one barrel of Pork with the head out, served out Molasses to the People Cloudy and Moderate Weather

Friday 13th

This Morning broke out the run and trimia the Vinegar and N. Ark cider Stowed 18 barrels of Provisions in the run

Saturday 14th

Strong breezes and Cloudy Weather Latitude at noon 8.07 S- at 2 o'clock saw Whales however no Success

Sunday 15th

Fine Moderate Weather Latitude at noon 7.40 S- Longitude by Lunar at 3 o'clock 82 W- at 6 o'clock spoke the Ship ^{Mr} Patch of N. Bedford 34 Months out 120 tons.
