

Remarks Sunday 9th October 1842.

This morning at day light saw Whales
lowered the Starboard boat took a 25
bl. Whale light breezes the most part of
this day

Lat at noon 4 34
Long of Chs. 179. 13 E.

Monday 10th

This day try'd out the Whale made
24 bls.

Lat at noon 5. 4 S.

Tuesday 11th

This morning fine gentle breeze and clear
Weather at 11 O'clock saw Whales lowered
the Starboard boat took a 15 bl. Whale
the Larboard boat took a very small one

Wednesday 12th Lat at noon 5. 15 S.

This morning commenced boiling, at 4
O'clock saw Whales lowered the Starboard
fastena and was capsized, the Larboard
boat saw Whale

Lat at noon 5. 48 S.

Thursday 13th

Long. 179. 26 E.

This morning cut in the Whale and
commenced boiling Lat at noon 5. 59 S.
finished boiling at 7 O'clock this Evening
made 13 bls.

Remarks Friday 14th October 1842.

This day fitted one of the Junk Cask
and made boat Bucket
saw a Whale going } Lat at noon 6. 28 S.
Quick to windward } Long of Chs. 179. 56 E.

Saturday 15th

This day Stow'd 44 bls. in 5 Kiers of oil
the Starboard side main hold,

Sunday 16th

Lat at noon 5. 40 S.

Light air and Clear Weather this day

Monday 17th

Lat at noon 5. 37 S.

This day set up one Shook, R. No 2
153 Gallons for fresh Water, Shook's two
old Kiers made one of them,

Tuesday 18th

Lat at noon 6. 9 S.

This morning, trim'd the Cask that contained
the Butter for oil, fitted the cask that
contained sea coals 215 Gallons for Water, Started
7 Barrels of Tar into Provisions bins 5 bls.
contained the whole, saw Whales this morning
to Mirawara pass.

Wednesday 19th

This day made a 200 Gall. Cask of old
Water Cask Staves, Weather squally at intervals

Lat at noon 6. 00 S.
