

Remarks Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1842.

Moderate Weather the most part of this day  
some Showers of Rain Lat at noon 5-20 S-  
Monday 12<sup>th</sup>

Light airs the most part and Cloudy Weather  
Made one Small Pier,

Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup>

First part of this Moderate and Cloudy  
with Steady rain Latter Strong gales  
at 6 o'clock furled fore and main topsails

Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup>

Strong gales and a heavy Sea, the whole  
of this day

Thursday 15<sup>th</sup>

This day the Weather more Moderate  
Winds from the Westward and a heavy  
swell Lat at noon 8-10 S-

Friday 16<sup>th</sup>

First part Moderate and Cloudy Weather  
Latter heavy Squalls attended with rain,  
made one small Pier

Saturday 17<sup>th</sup>

Moderate and Cloudy Weather and  
Plenty of Rain all this day

Sunday 18<sup>th</sup>

Moderate Weather the most part of this day

Remarks Monday 19<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1842

Fine clear Weather throughout this day  
Lat at noon 2-44 S-

Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup>

Light breezes and clear Weather  
Made one small Pier, Lat 2-30 S-

Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup>

Moderate Weather the most part of this  
day at 11 o'clock saw Whales toward  
the Success at 2 o'clock towed again  
the Harbores boat took a Tippet  
Whale, made one small Pier Lat 3-01 S-

Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup>

This morning cut in the Whale and  
commenced boiling, fine Weather this day

Friday 23<sup>rd</sup>

This day at noon finished boiling the  
Whale made about 32 bbls light airs  
and clear Weather

Saturday 24<sup>th</sup>

Fine Weather the whole of this day  
headed to the Southward

Sunday 25<sup>th</sup>

This day some heavy Showers of Rain

Monday 26<sup>th</sup>

This day removed one old Pier and  
tried one 285 Gall. cask for oil,  
Moderate Weather the most part.
