

Remarks Saturday 14th January 1843.

Strong breeze and a heavy swell this day
Lat 1. 54 S.

Sunday 15th
This morning spoke the ship Matilda of
London 19 months out 400 tns. Lat 1. 13 S.

Monday 16th
Fine pleasant weather this day trimed one
provision barrel for oil Lat at noon 00. 10 S.

Tuesday 17th
Fine pleasant weather this day steering West
made one 12th Rier Lat at noon 00 27 N.

Wednesday 18th
Fine weather this day steering West spoke
the ship Monticello of Kentucky 17 months
out 1000 tns saw Simpson's Island this afternoon
Lat at noon 10. 25 N.

Thursday 19th
Fine weather this day made one 11th Rier
Lat at noon 27 N.

Friday 20th
This day made one 10th Rier
saw Hall's Island Lat at noon 00 31 N.

Saturday 21th
This day plenty of Rain saw a sail to
windward of us No Obs.

Sunday 22nd
This day some showers of Rain spoke the Barque
Onyx of London 21 months out 1580 tns. Lat 29 S.

Monday 23rd
Raining the most part of this day spoke the
Matilda at sunset No Obs.

Tuesday 24th
Same Rain this day and thick hazy weather
Lat 1. 00. 40 S.

Wednesday 25th
This day the weather very squally at 3 o'clock
saw a whale the bar-boat took one
small one.

Thursday 26th
This morning the weather more favourable
at 11 the whale parted one of the cutting falls
commenced boiling at 11 o'clock.

Remarks Friday 27th January 1843.
This morning finished boiling made 24 tns
fine weather throughout this day.

Saturday 28th
Calm all this day Lat at noon 00 28 S.
made one Rier.

Sunday 29th
Light breeze and clear weather Lat at noon 22 S.
Spoke the Matilda and the Ship Edward Carey of
Punjab 16 months out 550 tns.

Monday 30th
This morning three sails in sight light breeze and
Calm some part of the day made one Rier.

Tuesday 31st
This day made one Rier light air and clear
weather the Edward Carey in sight to leeward of us.

Wednesday 1st February
This day saw squally attended with Rain
No Obs.

Thursday 2nd
The weather some squally and wind variable made one
Rier and trimed one bread cask for oil Lat. 39 S.

Friday 3rd
This day squally at intervals Lat at noon 36 S.

Saturday 4th
This day light air and some Rain Lat at noon 9 S.

Sunday 5th
This day calm the most part Lat at noon 6 S.
Long of Lunar 170 28 S.

Monday 6th
This day shook two old Riers remade one out
of them favourable weather Lat at noon 25 S.

Tuesday 7th
This day light air and calm. Lat at noon 32 S.

Wednesday 8th
This day squally attended with Rain saw a
Barque hauling to the Westward No Obs.

Thursday 9th
This day wind variable and light with
occasional Rain.
