 Moderate and cloudy weather wind Northerly
 Lat at noon 25 S-

Sunday 12th
 This day squalls at intervals at 10 o'clock saw
 Ocean Island bearing about 47 N by W distance 20 miles
 Lat at noon 42 S-

Monday 13th
 This day had squalls attended with rain

Tuesday 14th
 This day kept the baromet. Lat had squalls
 and some rain Lat at noon 55 S-

Wednesday 15th
 This morning started to be Eastward passing
 showers of rain at intervals Lat at noon 40 S-

Thursday 16th
 This morning saw Whales however no success at
 1 o'clock saw two boats and at 4 o'clock saw
 all boats no success fine weather this day wind
 Easterly made on then Lat at noon 59 South

Friday 17th
 This day strong breeze from the Northward Lat 1-10 S-

Saturday 18th
 This day made on fair fine weather a fresh breeze
 the most part of this day Lat at noon 1-12 S-

Sunday 19th
 This morning at 9 o'clock saw Whales however
 no success calm weather this day Lat 55 S-

Monday 20th
 This day calm trimed a corn cask Lat 50 S-

Tuesday 21st
 Fine weather this day spoke the ship Dominion
 of London 17 months out of London 8 months from Lancy
 1300 tons and the ship Young Phoenix of New Bedford
 26 months 2800 tons Lat at noon 11-5 S-

Wednesday 22nd
 Fine weather and a fresh breeze saw both ships
 this morning the English ship chased a whale at the
 forenoon no success Lat at noon 6-15 S-
 Long of Lancy 172 20. 30 S-

Remarks Thursday 23rd February 1843
 This morning gave a sail to leeward of us. rainy all the
 day no obs.

Friday 24th
 Calm weather attended with rain the most
 part of this day No obs-

Saturday 25th
 This day moderate breeze, some part Raining
 Lat at noon 1-44 S-

Sunday 26th
 This morning two sail in sight one of them boiling
 right and a calm this day Lat at noon 1-50 S-

Monday 27th
 Fine weather this day spoke the ship Oregon of
 Fairhaven 17 months out 950 tons Lat at noon 1-54 S-

Tuesday 28th
 This morning saw Whales however no success at 1
 o'clock spoke again the waste boat took a whale
 on the Oregon in sight of us, chasing also.
 Lat at noon 1-41 S-

Wednesday 1st March
 This day light breeze attended with rain at 3
 o'clock commenced boiling saw a ship ahead of us.
 Chasing Whales.

Thursday 2nd
 This morning chased Whales no success saw a
 ship to leeward of us take a whale supposed
 to be the Oregon,

Friday 3rd
 Fine moderate weather this day Lat at noon 5-2 S-
 at 15 minutes past 12 o'clock the Steward departed
 this day

Saturday 4th
 This morning at daylight saw a ship to leeward
 of us spoke her at 8 o'clock proved to be the ship
 Elizabeth of Salem 25 months out 950 tons. The Capⁿ
 came on board and the Steward was interde
 Lat at noon 1-7 S-

Sunday 5th
 This day calm and Raining the most part two ships
 in sight of us both of them steering for Ocean Island

Monday 6th
 This morning Ocean Island in sight saw two ships to
 leeward of us at noon about two miles from the Island
 cloudy weather the most part of this day
