Strong breeze and smoky weather
saw a long ^{boat} at 3 o'clock did not lower
for him Lat at noon 31. 38

Thursday 6th

Strong breeze some passing showers of rain
and cloudy weather the most part of the day
the ship

Friday 7th

Fine pleasant weather this day
saw a ship & a Barge to windward of us.
The ship was boiling Lat at noon 31. 25 N.

Saturday 8th

Fine weather this day spoke the
Barge Lexington of Providence 19 months out
350 bbls. Lat at noon 31. 13 N

Sunday 9th

Fine moderate weather this day Lat 31. 22 N

Monday 10th

First part of this day some passing showers
of fog with a little rain latter fine moderate
weather Lat at noon 31. 54 N

Tuesday 11th

Light air this day and cloudy the most part
Lat at noon 31. 08 N

Wednesday 12th

Fine clear weather this day saw three
sails to leeward of us and one to windward
Lat at noon 30. 11 N

Thursday 13th

Fine weather this day saw two sails to
leeward of us Lat at noon 29. 21 N

Friday 14th

Fine moderate weather this day saw a
sail to leeward of us Lat at noon 30. 13 N

Saturday 15th

Fine pleasant weather saw five
sails this day Lat at noon 30. 10 N

Sunday 16th

Fine weather this day at noon
spoke the Elizabeth of Salem saw the Adeline Gibbs
prop to windward of us Lat at noon 29. 52
Long of Lunar 164 59. 30

Remarks Monday 17 July 1843-

Fine pleasant weather this day sent the fore
top gaff ~~and~~ mast aloft and out flying Gib boom
Lat at noon 28. 47 N
Long of Lunar 164 56 E-

Tuesday 18th

This morning saw Whales headed to windward
going quick toward but no success Lat at noon 29. 41
The sail in sight, Long of Lunar 165 13 E-

Wednesday 19th

This morning saw Whales lower for them after a
long chase the Larboard boat took her Logg his
line and craft the Waste boat stove a little
Lat at noon 29. 16 N

Thursday 20th

This day cut in the Whales spoke the ship
Frances of New Bedford 34 months out 1500 bbls-

Friday 21th

Strong breeze and a heavy swell saw
a ship prop to windward of us trying out this day

Saturday 22nd

Strong breeze and a heavy swell saw a ship
prop to leeward of us Employed as yesterday

Sunday 23rd

This morning finished boiling made about
80 bbls. Rain the most part of this day

Monday 24th

Fair weather this day saw a sail
to windward of us Lat at noon 29. 07 N

Tuesday 25th

This day stowed 80 bbls. of oil in Starboard
side main hatchway Lat at noon 29. 42 N

Wednesday 26th

Fine weather saw a ship to windward of us
made our small Rier, Lat at noon 28. 38 N

Thursday 27th

Fine moderate weather winds Easterly two sail in
sight, made our Rier, Lat at noon 28. 56 N

Friday 28th

Balm the most part of this day
made two 10 fms Riers, two ships in sight of us
Lat at noon 29. 18 N
