

Remarks Thursday 22nd Feb. 1844

Rain Squalls throughout this day saw
a sail to the westward of us set up one hook
No. 34 = 163 Gallons

Friday 23rd

Fine Weather this day saw a small Island in
sight, set up five hooks No. 32 = 165, 33 = 256, 34 = 222,
644 = 228, 39 = 289

Saturday 24th

Fine pleasant Weather this day, this forenoon
saw Whales towed, for them the Larboara boat
took in small sail, the Island at noon bore NW by N
28 miles

Sunday 25th

This morning finished loading about 20 cals.
Afternoon saw a sail close to the Island

Monday 26th

This day fair Weather, a sail in sight set up
a hook No. 38 = 258 Gallons

Tuesday 27th

Strong gales throughout this day, Lat 6.04 N

Wednesday 28th

Strong breezes and cloudy Weather steering West till
sun set Lat at noon 6.42 N

Thursday 29th

Fine Weather this day steering West Lat 6.47 N

Friday 1st March

Some showers of Rain this day at 11 o'clock saw
Wellington Island, bore south about 10 miles

Lat 6.55 N

Saturday 2nd

This day Parting showers of rain saw the
Island Ascension and at sun set about 15 miles Distance

Sunday 3rd

This morning came to an anchor in the Bay at the
Island Ascension

Monday 4th

This day stowed down 20 cals. of oil in the after hold
fine clear Weather

Tuesday 5th

This day sent a Raft of cane in shore and filled them

Remarks Wednesday 6th March 1844
This day brought off 3 boats load of Wood

Thursday 7th

This day the Larboara Watch on Liberty
brought 3 boats load of Wood

Friday 8th

This day the Larboara Watch on Liberty
brought two boats Load of Wood

Saturday 9th

This day Starboara Watch on Liberty
Painted the Starboara star and stern, four lines
Ascension

Sunday 10th

This day the Larboara Watch on Liberty

Monday 11th

This day the Addison came in

Thursday 14th

This day brought off a Raft of Water

This morning weighed anchor for
Cruz

Wednesday 20th

This day at 2 o'clock, at St. Augustus
Island, shipped my men and cargo at Ascension
left four of the old hands at Ascension, all abandoned
