

Remarks on board

Thursday January 1st 1846
commences with light air at South
steering by N West at 7 took in
sail made pinbacks at daylight made
all sail course ship to S West
the weather thick and foggy
Latter part strong wind at N
the dark

Lat by Obs 39° 36'
Long by Obs 164° 25'

Friday January 2nd

commences with strong gales from
the North at 11 took in light
sails at 7 took in all sail set
storm sails wind
at midnight a tempest with rain
in torrents at 7 still raining at noon
shift thunder and lightning
the wind moderates
started mist

Lat by Obs 39° 00'
Long by Obs 164° 30'

Saturday January 3rd

commences with moderate breezes with
thick rainy weather with thunder
and lightning at 8 were ship to
N West wind E N East

at daylight strong wind from
S West course N West fore sail halyards
gib and main sail 9 10 set main sail
main top gale sail at 11 fore top
gale sail

Lat by Obs 40° 00'
Long by Obs 163° 48'

Ship Nocturna

Sunday January 4th 1846

commences with strong wind from S West
course N West at 10 a plenty pinbacks
in site at 7 took in sail

at daylight a gale of S West set halyards
top sails course N West by N the sand
pinbacks

So ends these 4 hours

Lat by Obs 38° 24'
by D R Long 163° 00'

Monday January 5th

commences with a gale took in sail
hove too heading off by S at 4 PM
saw a ship steering N E Wind
South by West

at daylight made sail course N West
very heavy sea running but no
sea whales to be seen
started water

Lat by Obs 37° 27'
Long by Obs 162° 12'

Tuesday January 6th

commences with strong winds from
S East course N East at 7 took in
sail lipped to E South

at daylight strong breezes from S W
by West course N East made all sail
weather fine

Lat by Obs 36° 34'
D R Long 163° 00'
