

Remarks Onboard

Friday February 5th 1846

commences with strong breezes at
8th running down the Land
saw a brig steering to the North
at 4th took in life sails at 6th set
the main topgallant sail at 7th PM
the Land 4 Leags Dist bearing
S by East steering by the wind
S by East bent the chains and
got the anchor off the bow
at daylight life airs 1 Laured went in
boat got the pilot off to the ship.
So Ends there 24 hours 34.22

Saturday February 6th

commences with life winds brought
the ship up in the passage in 5
fathoms water at 8 PM took the
anchor hooked on 12 boats tied in
to our birth came too at 9 PM
the Henry Bronson & Co. Mariner there
fisher were lying here
at daylight the watch ashore on
liberty So Ends there 24 hours 34.55

Sunday, Friday 8th

fine weather by at anchor
at daylight a party watering another
wooding the ship Henry went for ice

Monday February 9th
commences with fine weather
watering

Tuesday February 10th
weather fine painting wood
ing and watering at daylight
very hot and calm

So Ends there 24 hours

Lying in Mangarua Bay

Wednesday February 11th 1846
the watch on liberty, getting off water
the other watch

Thursday February 12th

getting off wood water &c
at daylight took off 9 cart water

Friday February 13th

fine weather middle part rain wind
S by East blows fresh
at daylight took off a load of wood

Saturday February 14th

fine pleasant weather
at daylight raining at 10 loosed top sails
to dry 2 small crafts came in
2 boats 2 men down to with eating
poison berries sick

Sunday February 15th
commences with fine weather at 2 PM
the Captain went trading across the
bay 20 miles Dist
the men are better from the effects
of the poison at 4 PM raining
at daylight fine life wind took on
board 5 tons potatoes

Monday February 16th
fine weather the Captain came back
from trading arrived ship Mangarua
Capt 17 m Pao at daylight rain

Tuesday February 17th
raining at daylight washed off deck
fine weather wind S West
blows a gale
