Wednesday February 18th 1846

commences with a strong breeze at 8 AM
dried sails at 4 PM had a dance
weather fine at daylight have shot
at 5 AM took out anchor and
hoed out to sea at 10 a breeze
from W by West took the anchors
and chains course N E by E the
the Land No till to Day
bearing S East 25 miles Distance

Thursday February 19th

commences with a strong gale
from West by South course N East
at 5 spoke the Mariathersay both
bound to N West coast
at daylight sailing

Long 177 " 7

Friday February 20th

commences with like winds course
E by East saw 2 ships spoke the
English Ship Ranger 13 m 500 spinn
laid aback all night
coming at daylight wind like
course E by East 2 sails in sight
saw a sunfish

Saturday February 21st 1846

commences with like winds at West
and veers to N West course E by East
at 3 raised a sail steering N the
at daylight like winds sail in sight
saw plenty birds

Sunday February 22nd

commences with like winds from
S by South course N East ran
grampers east the Mardoon 40
at daylight strong breezes from S by E
course N East saw breaches

Lat by 31 " 27 S
Long 179 " 13 West

Monday
Sunday February 22nd

commences with strong breezes
course by N East saw breaches jump
at daylight blows strong
S East blades steering by N East
hook in topgallant sails at 9
set them again at 10 took them
in squally saw plenty birds
