commences with light breezes from the Westward covers N.E. East at daylight wind veers to Westward and light weather fine

Sunday March 8th commences with a calm at 11 a light breeze from the Eastward tacked ship to the N.E. East at 11 met hale at daylight a breeze from E.S. E. at 12 tacked off shore at 5 tacked in shore wind continues light at 11 saw a sail at noon the Land Bearing N. 1/2 E. 20 miles Dist a strong current a gale us setting S.W. West
