

Remarks On board

Monday March 9th 1845
commences with like breezes at 8 East
at 8 heavy showers at 10 calm close
in to the Land. Loaded 3 boats
toed the ship off took a breeze
took the boats up at 9 P.M. the Land
5 miles distant at daylight standing
in at 4 the captain with 2 boats
on shore trading for hogs

Lat 134 " 4
171.05 E

Tuesday March 10th
commences with strong breezes
squally weather at 6 the boats
came off having obtained 5 hogs
300, 3 coconuts and 10 bananas some for
ye made sail stood on our course
at 10 squally at daylight wind like

Wednesday March 11th
commences with squally weather
covers N.E. by N.W. at 4 but like
at daylight wind S.E. but like
squally

Lat 11 " 27
Long 170 " 15
D.R. 170 " 00

Thursday March 12th
commences with like wind from
the South covers N.E. by N.W.
at 11 covers East wind very light
at daylight squally covers N.E. by E
continues to rain till noon
wind S.W.

Lat by D.R. 9 " 52
at 4 P.M. 10 " 00 S
Long by same 169 " 50 W

Ship Kootzuma

Friday March 13th 1845
commences with like winds from the
S.W. covers N.E. East at daylight
wind S.W. at 11 like veers to S.W.

Lat 13 9 " 50
Long D.R. 169 " 30

Saturday March 14th

commences with like winds at 8 West
at 4 P.M. sent down fore topsail
bent another covers N.E. East
at daylight strong wind from the S.W.
with rain covers West by N.W.

Lat D.R. 7 " 35
Long D.R. 168 " 30

Sunday March 15th

commences with strong West winds with
rain covers N.E. East at 4 wind like
wet hole and parpaigs
at daylight like airs at N.W. West
covers by N.E. at noon calm

Lat 6 " 20
Long D.R. 164 " 35

Monday March 16th
commences calm at 4 P.M. a light
breeze from S.W. covers N.W. by N.
at 6 East at daylight wind
N.W. at 8 calm the watch
employed repairing fore topsail

Lat 6 " 50
Long D.R. 164 " 20
