

Remarks on board

Saturday July 25th 1846
strong breezes & ships in sight & bailing
cutting & towing in West at daylight
3 sails in sight were ship to N. West
humpbacks in sight 57° 50' N
142° 30' W

Sunday July 26th
Whales fine like weather & whales in sight
lowered missed one galled & other
2 ships in sight at daylight wind S. East
saw a dead whale told him to the ship cut
him in last the head a good whale
Lat 58° 00'
Long 142° 05'

Monday July 27th
all hands employed cutting 3 whales in sight
2 ships bailing at 5 finished cutting began
to hail at daylight fine weather 3 sails in
sight 2 got whales 3 cutting
Lat 57° 30'
Long 141° 50'

Tuesday July 28th
fine like weather saw whales going
Whales quick & ships in sight covers by E. S. E.
still bailing & towing in in upper half
at daylight foggy 2 sails in sight at 11
lowered chaf 2 whales at 10 could down
Lat 57° 00'
Long 141° 10'

Wednesday July 29th
Whales foggy saw whales spoke ship Tiger
Stonington 10 whales at daylight
whales in sight going quick
boarded chaf them with out success
broke out 55 lbs oil in paper
Pipes black
Lat 57° 34'
Long 143° 20'

Ship Kortezuma

Thursday July 30th 1846
commences with fine like weather
whales going quick & ships in sight
were ship to E. S. East at daylight &
cours E. S. E. at 7 by the wind sand and
chaf whales 2 ships in sight 57° 4
Lat 60° 141° 29' W

Friday July 31st
commences with strong breezes thick weather
at 5 the Julian chasing a whale
boarded stretch and killed took
her to the ship took in sail
at 8 clock hooked on cut in the whale
at 11 finished cutting it blows a gale
at 11 S. West Lat 60° 57° 28
Long 141° 10'

Saturday August 1st 1846
commences with a gale blowing too heading
at daylight blows strong at 7
first fore and main topsails got down
humpbacks commenced bailing at 9 o'clock
at noon raining Lat 57° 06
141

Sunday August 2nd
blows a smart gale cool & down
at 4 took in main topsail & 2 gale
cours by S. E. East wind W. S. West
at daylight like wind made all
sail cours by were ship to the N. West
saw 2 whales going quick
Lat 56° 52
Long 140° 50'

Monday August 3rd
calm 1 sail in sight saw a ship back
in sail at daylight sand a ship in
sight 3 ships in sight commenced bailing
at daylight
Lat 56° 57
Long 141° 25'
