

# Remarks on Ship

Thursday November 19<sup>th</sup> 1845  
 commences with a moderate gale from  
 the S West at 5 wore ship took  
 in fore sail at daylight strong  
 breeze a high sea at 10 wore ship  
 to the S by East

Lat by Obs 38 " 03

Friday November 20<sup>th</sup>  
 the wind moderates and veers to N by  
 at 1 P.M. set double reefed topsails gale  
 at 6 journeyed out reefs covers S by East  
 at daylight more moderate wind at the  
 veers to West and pieces squid

Lat by Obs 39 " 06  
 Long by Obs 159 " 40

Saturday November 21<sup>st</sup>  
 strong breeze from the N West  
 covers S by East at 5 saw a sail  
 at daylight wind like at S West  
 made all sail covers S East

Lat by Obs 40 " 40 S

Sunday November 22<sup>nd</sup>

Whale weather fine saw a weight whale  
 loared but could not strike  
 took in like sails 8<sup>th</sup> courses heading  
 to the south West at day like saw  
 2 whales chart they are very mild

Lat by Obs 41 " 33

Monday November 23<sup>rd</sup>  
 strong breeze spoke ship George D<sup>d</sup>  
 Mary N London 14<sup>th</sup> gunned with  
 her at daylight strong breeze  
 made sail covers S East

# Ship Montezuma

Tuesday November 24<sup>th</sup> 1845  
 Whales thick and rainy wind to the south  
 ward at 4 S by E took in sail head  
 ing S East at daylight like air  
 made sail at 5 set all sail at 10  
 blows a gale took in like sails reefed  
 down at 1 post 11 still low bent  
 fastened to a whale 10 ends

Lat by Obs 42 " 00

Wednesday November 25<sup>th</sup>  
 off past to a whale it blows a gale  
 killed him rove head ropes feet in  
 Whales wafe left him 2 miles to wind  
 ward very rough went on board  
 carried sail till tonight took in  
 gale 9<sup>th</sup> Main sail rest of rig in  
 at daylight a gale wore ship

Lat by Obs 41 " 58

Long by Obs 158 " 55

Thursday November 26<sup>th</sup>

still blows strong a heavy sea rising  
 at 2 set fore topsail 8<sup>th</sup> gale at 3 took  
 them in gear at 7 wore ship to N East  
 at daylight moderates a little at 9 wore  
 ship made sail saw our whale took  
 him along side put 6 fluke ropes  
 on him parted 2 of them

Lat by Obs 41 " 57

Friday November 27<sup>th</sup>  
 blows a gale could not cut  
 the watch employed parting and put  
 ing on fluke ropes  
 at daylight like blows a gale at 8  
 commenced cutting bad work  
 but saved the whale

Lat by Obs 41 " 45
