Tuesday the 14th

This Day commenced with Light winds from the N by W and stean by Lambboard Jack all hands employed in Ship's Duty Saw a great number of right Whales This Day found with the in a Nothing more remarkable occurred so ends this Day with fine weather Latitude 43.26 Longitude 75 West Greenland

Wednesday the 15th

This Day commenced with gentle breezes from the N by E and stean close to with Lamb Jacks at 9 am got up topgallmast and yard bent the old spinnaces and unstacked the New ones away saw great many right Whales one haul off of the ship at 9 am Duck ed and stood to the S of the Nothing more remarkable occurred so ends this Day Latitude 42 South Longitude 75 West

Thursday the 16th

This Day commenced with strong breezes from the N by E and stean close to with Lamb Jack Nothing going on this Day off any consequence started Barrell off Deck saw Serrell right Whales ship in company so ends this Day Latitude 41.20 Long 75.50

Friday the 17th January

This Day commenced with light winds from the South Coast North, water below and the rest employed in stowing Spars got out the Fly jib boom Nothing seen from shaft but the other ship so ends this Day Latitude 40.00 South 75.30 West

Coast off Chilly

Tuesday the 18th January

This Day commenced with light airs and Calms bent the fore main and halyard topsails of the main sail of the spanker and topmast staysel all hands employed in Ship's Duty saw Serrell off points of land this Day with off fresh breeze from the N by E commenced stars 3 watches Latitude 35.50 South

Wednesday the 19th January

This Day commenced with gentle wind from the South N made the ice de la moche spoke 1 ship & saw 3 at 2 pm took in the topsails heavy showers of rain continued 5 pm and then cleared away fine weather saw 1000 for the night Latitude de la M King de la Moche

Thursday the 20th

This Day commenced with light winds from the N by E stean close to Booke up the hole and got up 4 cast off water at 9 finish saw 1000 haul got 1 hooked on Rail to the piece let him go stean for the night took in sail 2 ship in sight saw land in sight so ends this Day Latitude de la Moche King de la Moche

Friday the 21st

This Day commenced with fine weather put in the whale ad on board and got another got the head cut up and began to deal like the other whale after the haul is cold aboard off the lee bow so ends this Day Latitude 37 South Long 75.50

Saturday the 22nd Day

This Day commenced with fine weather flaked the fiere and hooked on at 12 4/4 got in the whale began to boil cut up the head and washed off saw Serrell him, back land close to so ends this Day Latitude 36 Long Long 75
